



ABSTRACT

Disaster Management – Covid-19 - Outbreak of Epidemic Covid-19 - Welfare of migrant labourers (accommodation facilities, food arrangements, medical treatment and transportation arrangements) – Sanction a sum of Rs.41,32,85,702/- (Rupees Forty one crore thirty two lakhs eighty five thousand seven hundred and two only) from the Prime Minister's Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situations Fund (PM CARES Fund)– Orders – Issued.

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ORDER:

In the letter first read above, the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India has informed that assistance of Rs.1000 crore will be given to States and UTs from PM-CARES fund for strengthening the existing measures being taken for the welfare of the migrant labourers. This amount will be distributed in two instalments – Rs.500 crore now and remaining Rs.500 crore by 15th June 2020. The amount will be distributed through National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) to a dedicated separate bank account to be opened by the State Disaster Management Agencies (SDMAs) for further distribution to District Collectors/Municipal Commissioners for strengthening their efforts in providing accommodation facilities, making food arrangements, providing medical treatment and

making transportation arrangements of the migrant labourers. This amount will be distributed to all the States / UTs in separate account of the State Disaster Management Authority and further distributed to District Disaster Management Authority / District Collector for the above said purpose.

2. Accordingly, in the G.O second read above, a separate bank account was opened in Secretariat branch, Indian Overseas Bank. The details of bank account are as follows:-

Subsequently, an amount of Rs.39,74,50,000/- being the first installment and an amount of Rs.43,77,70,000/- being the second installment totaling an amount of Rs.83,52,20,000/- has been received from PM CARES Fund for the State Government of Tamil Nadu and the same is credited into the above bank account.

4. In the Government Order third read above, orders have been issued regarding modalities for utilization of PM CARES funds and also to sanction funds for individual proposals to be released from PM CARES funds for the welfare of migrant labourers, after approval by the State Executive Committee of State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) comprising of Chief Secretary to Government, Additional Chief Secretary (Revenue and Disaster Management), Additional Chief Secretary (Finance), Additional Chief Secretary (Home), Principal Secretary (Public Works), Principal Secretary (Highways and Minor Ports) and also including the concerned Secretary i.e. Additional Chief Secretary (Labour and Employment) in this case, as it involves welfare of migrant labourers.

5. In the letter fourth read above, the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated that, all the District Collector (Except Chennai) and the Commissioner, Greater Chennai Corporation have sent proposals towards the expenditure incurred for the welfare of migrant labourers viz., providing accommodation facilities, making food arrangements, providing medical treatment and making transportation of the migrant labourers.

6. The Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration has further stated that on scrutiny of the proposals received from the District Collectors and Commissioner, Greater Chennai Corporation, Chennai expenditure incurred on or after 20.05.2020 towards the items mentioned are found eligible and accordingly, funds requested by the District Collectors were restricted, wherever the items are not applicable.

The break-up details of the fund requested, amount incurred and fund recommended for sanctioning under PM CARES Fund is given below:-

The Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration has therefore recommended to sanction a sum of **Rs.41,32,85,702/-** (Rupees Forty one crore thirty two lakhs eighty five thousand seven hundred and two only) to the District Collectors and Commissioner, Greater Chennai Corporation, Chennai from PM CARES Fund towards the welfare of migrant labourers (accommodation facilities, food arrangements, medical treatment and transportation arrangements) as detailed in para 6 above.

8. The Government, after careful consideration of the proposal of the Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration and approval of the State Executive Committee (SDRF and PM CARE FUND), accord sanction for a sum of **Rs.41,32,85,702/- (Rupees Forty one crore thirty two lakhs eighty five thousand seven hundred and two only)** from the PM CARES Fund towards the welfare of migrant labourers (accommodation facilities, food arrangements, medical treatment and transportation arrangements) as detailed below:-
