Disaster Management – Cyclone "Burevi" - Heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall from 02.12.2020 to 05.12.2020 – Distribution of Mineral Mixture and Fodder to the Cattle – Sanction a sum of Rs.6,21,284/- (Rupees Six lakhs twenty one thousand two hundred and eighty four only) from State Fund to the Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services Department - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:-

In the letter third read above, the Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated as follows:-

- (i) The IMD in its Bulletin No.1, dated 30.11.2020, issued a warning that the Depression over southeast Bay of Bengal, would intensify into a cyclonic storm and emerge into Comorin area on 3rd December, 2020 morning. Subsequently, IMD in its Bulletin No.25, dated 03.12.2020, stated that the Cyclonic Storm 'Burevi' over Gulf of Mannar close to Pamban weakened into a Deep Depression and would cross Ramanathapuram and Thoothukudi districts during 3rd December, 2020 night to 4th December, 2020 early hours with wind speed of 50-60 gusting to 70 kmph. On 4.12.2020, the IMD in its Bulletin 32, reported that the Deep Depression subsequently weakened into a Depression and is likely to remain practically stationary and thereafter weaken into a Well Marked Low Pressure area. Though the Cyclone 'Burevi' weakened, it remained practically stationary which brought heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall in most of the districts resulting in huge flow of water in the rivers causing inundation in low lying areas.

- (ii) The State experienced heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall from 02.12.2020 to 05.12.2020 in many Rain gauge stations across the State. To be more specific, in Cuddalore, Tiruvarur and Nagapattinam Districts, heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall has been recorded from 02.12.2020 to 05.12.2020. Moreover, on 03.12.2020 late night, there has been torrential rains leading to water stagnation in many pockets of the Chennai City and few coastal districts and interior districts have also experienced continuous showers.

2. The Additional Chief Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration has further stated that, the Director, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services, has informed that the cyclonic storm BUREVI devastated the state between 4.12.2020 and 6.12.2020 and ravaged the Districts of Cuddalore, Dindigul, Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai, Pudukottai, Ramanathapuram Sivagangai, Thanjavur, Thiruvallur, Tiruchirapalli, Ranipet, Villupuram and Kallakurichi due to very heavy rainfall. The following were the actions taken by Animal Husbandry Department:-

- ❖ Department of Animal Husbandry has established of **297 relief camps** in affected areas to reach to the sick, dying and injured animals with the help of Veterinary doctors, Para veterinary staff and ancillary staff and **29,470 number** of Animals were Vaccinated.
- ❖ **421 numbers of Teams** have been formed at district level to evacuate the affected animals quickly and rapidly to safer places identified for the purpose. Animals were sheltered and provided with required feed and water to ensure the nutritional needs and reduces illness.
- ❖ All injured animals were provided with immediate Veterinary assistance. Precaution on pest control along with proper hygiene and sanitation was also followed. **7345 kgs Mineral Mixture** with the value of Rs.3,48,379 were distributed.
- ❖ **11,065 kgs of dry fodder** with the value of Rs. 50,275 were distributed. **29,800 kgs of Green fodder** with the value of Rs. 47,350 were distributed.
- ❖ The following are the additional Arrangements made in highly affected districts such as Nagapattinam and Cuddalore:-
 - 3 and 4 numbers of AMMA ambulances diverted to Nagapattinam and Cuddalore Districts respectively.
 - 3 RRT teams each from Thanjavur, Trichy and Ariyalur Districts diverted to Nagapattinam District
 - 3 RRT teams each from Villupuram, Thiruvannamalai and Perambalur Districts diverted to Cuddalore Districts.

The Director, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services has requested to release a **sum of Rs. 85.74 lakh (Rupees Eight Five Lakh Seventy Four Thousand only) towards compensation to the farmers for loss of livestock and Poultry and other expenditure incurred by Animal Husbandry Department.**

The Additional Chief Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration has also stated that the proposals of the Director, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services has been examined with the SDRF norms prescribed in the Government Order first read above, the fund of Rs.6,21,284/- is eligible under SDRF as follows:-

The Additional Chief Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration has requested to sanction a sum of Rs.6,21,284/- (Rupees Six lakh twenty one thousand and two hundred and eighty four only) from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) during heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall from 02.12.2020 to 05.12.2020 due to "Burevi" cyclone.

5. The Government, after careful examination accept the proposal of the Additional Chief Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration and based on the approval of the State Executive Committee, accord sanction a sum of Rs.6,21,284/- (Rupees Six lakh twenty one thousand and two hundred and eighty four only) from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to the Animal Husbandry Department due to "Burevi" cyclone during heavy rainfall to extremely heavy rainfall from 02.12.2020 to 05.12.2020.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para-5 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

The Treasury Officer / Pay and Accounts Officer's concerned are requested to open the above new head in their books.
