ORDER:

In the reference third read above, the Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated that the Chief Engineer, Highways Department has stated that, in Ooty, 467 trees and in Pollachi , 89 trees were uprooted. In all, 556 trees were uprooted and fell on the road which were removed immediately and traffic restored in a short duration with the help of Highways gangs and road inspectors. Total Numbers of earth slides restored were 222. Sixty-four JCBs were engaged to remove the slided soil and trees and 13 trucks were used to convey the slided earth. In addition to regular gangs, 539 special labourers were engaged to remove the trees and soil from the road. Around 5330 sand bags were used to protect erosion on Berms. Damaged Roads were fixed with patches for a length of 17.65 Km .The details of damages in each division have been given as below.

2. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has further stated that there were land slips in more than 183 places, 467 trees were uprooted along the Highways Road. 5 Culverts completely collapsed. 53 JCBs, 34 Power Saws and 385 labourers were engaged for temporary restoration and that the Rough cost estimate for the temporary Restoration work in Udhalgal (H) C&M Division is **Rs.11.55 Lakhs.**

POLLACHI (H) C&M DIVISION

Due to heavy intensity of rains, 45 Kms length of Highways Road under Pollachi (H) C&M Division were badly damaged. There were land slips at more than 39 places. 89 trees have been uprooted along the Highways Road. , 11 JCB s, 13 Tippers, 10 Power Saws, 154 labourers and more than 4820 sand bags were used for temporary restoration works. Heavy rain occurred in Valparai area for 7 days are detailed below:-

The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has also stated that the Rough cost estimate for the temporary Restoration works in Pollachi(H) C&M Division is Rs.17.12 Lakhs. The Chief Engineer, Highways, has requested for sanction a sum of Rs.28.67 lakhs (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakhs and Sixty Seven Thousand only) for temporary restoration works (Removing wind fallen trees, engaging labour, tippers, JCBs, etc.,) as detailed below:-

The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration the has also stated that the proposal of the Chief Engineer, Highways , for sanction of sum of Rs.28.67 lakhs (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakhs and Sixty Seven Thousand only) for the temporary restoration works carried out in Udhagai and Pollachi(H) C&M Divisions, has been examined in detail with reference to the SDRF norms prescribed in G.O. Ms. No. 380, Revenue Department, dated 27.10.2015 and the entire amount of **Rs.28.67 lakhs** requested by Chief Engineer, Highways, is covered under SDRF. The details are given below:-

5. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has therefore requested orders of the Government to sanction a sum of Rs.28.67 lakhs (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakhs and Sixty Seven Thousand only) to Highways Department for temporary restoration works (Removing wind fallen trees, engaging labour, tippers, JCBs, etc.,) carried out in the flood affected areas in Udhagai and Pollachi(H) C&M Divisions,during the South West Monsoon 2020.

6. The Government after careful consideration, accept the Proposal of the Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration and based on the approval of the State Executive Committee accord sanction a sum of Rs.28.67 lakhs (Rupees Twenty Eight Lakhs and Sixty Seven Thousand only) from Sate Disaster Response Fund (State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to Highways Department for temporary restoration works (Removing wind fallen trees, engaging labour, tippers, JCBs, etc.,) carried out in the flood affected areas in Udhagai and Pollachi(H) C&M Divisions,during the South West Monsoon 2020.

7. The amount sanctioned in paragraph 6 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

"2245 Relief on account of Natural Calamities - 02- Flood, Cyclones, etc., - 106- Repairs and Restoration of Damaged Roads and Bridges - State's Expenditure - AA-Repairs and Restoration of Damaged Roads and bridges due to Floods - 317 - Minor Works – 01 Minor Works."

8. Necessary additional funds of Rs.28,67,000/- will be provided in RE/FMA 2020-2021. Pending provision of such funds, the Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration is authorized to draw and disburse the amount. The expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislative Assembly by Specific inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2020-2021. The Additional Chief Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration is requested to sent necessary proposal for inclusion of the expenditure in Revised Estimate 2020-2021 and also to send necessary draft Explanatory Note for specific inclusion in the supplementary Estimate 2020-2021 to Finance (BG-I/Revenue) Department without fail at appropriate time.
