Disaster management – North East Monsoon 2021- sanction for a sum of Rs.35.09 Crore from State Disaster Response Fund to the farmers for Crop damages to Agricultural and Horticultural crops due to heavy rains during North East Monsoon 2021 – Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

In the letter fifth read above, the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated that, due to the heavy downpour Agriculture crops damaged to an extent of 51,890.92 hectare which includes samba Paddy and Other than Paddy crops for an extent of 49,230.55 Hectare and Late Kar-Kuruvai-Sornawari crops to an extent of 2,660.64 Hectare. Further, Horticultural crops were also damaged to an extent of 1,795.09 Hectare.

2. In the press release fourth read above, The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has announced as follows:

நடப்பு சம்பா பருவத்தில் நடவு செய்து, நீரில் மூழ்கி சேதமடைந்த பயிர்களை மறு சாகுபடி செய்திட ஏதுவாக, பாதிக்கப்பட்ட விவசாயிகளுக்கு ஹெக்டேர் ஒன்றுக்கு 6 ஆயிரத்து 38 ரூபாய் மதிப்பீட்டில் இடு பொருள்கள் பின்வருமாறு வழங்க மாண்புமிகு முதலமைச்சர் அவர்கள் உத்தரவிட்டார்கள்.

3. The principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has stated as follows:-

- i. The Director, Horticulture has stated that the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) norms and guidelines are specified in the Government Order first read above, there is no limitation on land holding to the individual farmer, to claim input subsidy for > 33% affected Horticultural Crops under SDRF in the event of natural calamities.
- ii. He has also been informed that during the Drought year (2015-16) and in the Gaja cyclone (2018) the input subsidy was restricted to 2 Ha. of the affected area for the individual farmer. However, during Nivar, Burevi and the unseasonal rain in January 2021, input subsidy was extended to the affected area without any limitation.
- iii. He has been further informed that as on 15.12.2021, affected Horticulture crops due to the heavy downpour of North East Monsoon (NEM) was 1795.09 Ha which has been covered under the net sown area.
- iv. Further, the Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has stated that the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) norms and guidelines are specified in the Government Order first read above, in which no limitations on land holding to the individual

farmers to claim input subsidy for the affected Agricultural crops under State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) in the event of Natural Calamities.

- v. However, during the Drought year (2015-16) and in the Gaja cyclone (2018) the input subsidy claim was restricted to 2 ha of the affected area for individual farmers. During Nivar, Burevi and the unseasonal rains in January 2021, input subsidy claim was extended without any limitation on the affected land holding.
- vi. As on 11.12.2021, Agricultural crops to an extent of 1,59,585.54 Ha were affected due to heavy downpour during NEM 2021. The limitation of 2 Ha. farmer is applied and area affected within net sown area only, confirming to State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) norms.
- vii. The Director of Agriculture has further informed that, based on the Announcement dated 16.11.2021 made by the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, a proposal for extending Relief input Package of seeds and other inputs for Paddy crop affected at Vegetative stage to an extent of 46,973.99 ha was sent through Office of the Commissioner of Revenue Administration @ Rs.6038/ per Ha.
- viii. He has been informed that as the season has almost crossed and Paddy crop has reached maturity stage, the distribution of seeds, Fertilizers and Zinc Sulphate will not be useful to the farmers at present and that the Farmers / Farmers' group have also represented to issue Relief as Cash subsidy instead of Relief Package. In this circumstances, the Director of Agriculture has requested to consider and extend cash subsidy through Direct Benefit Transfer mode instead of distributing Relief Input Package for Paddy as follows:-

- ix. He has also informed that as per the norms of assistance ordered in the Government Order first read above, there is no ceiling limit of 2 Ha. per Farmers for sanction of Input Subsidy to the crops damaged more than 33 % due to Natural Calamities.
- x. Hence, the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has requested that necessary orders may be passed sanctioning Input Subsidy relief assistance to the affected

farmers whose crops have been damaged due to heavy rains during North East Monsoon 2021 as the reasons furnished by the Director of Agriculture and the Director of Horticulture are found to be reasonable. It is also informed that this proposal also does not involve any additional expenditure.

4. The principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration has further stated that the proposals received from the Directors of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare and Horticulture & Plantation crops are detailed as follows:

Proposal - I - Agricultural Crop damages

The Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has reported that the total extent of samba crop damages is 49,230.55 Hectare which includes Paddy, Oil seed, Pulses, Sugarcane, Cotton and Millets as detailed below:

Further, he has stated that the Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare have reported that damages were caused to Late Kar-Kuruvai-Sornawari crops to an extent of 2,660.37 Hectare. He has also informed that the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has announced that relief amount of Rs.20,000/- will be provided to the above said crops fully. As per Sl.No.5 (B) (d) r/w in the Government Order first read above, input subsidy where crop loss is 33% and above is Rs.13,500/- per hectare for irrigated crops under State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF). However, based on the announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu the enhanced relief assistance may be provided to the affected farmers at the rate of Rs.13,500 under State Disaster Response Fund and Rs.6,500/- under State fund as detailed below:

Further, he has also stated that the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has announced that relief assistance of Rs.6,038/- will be provided to the affected farmers whose early Samba crops were sub-merged in rain water. Now the Director of Agriculture has stated that as the season has almost crossed and Paddy crop has reached maturity stage, the distribution of seeds, Fertilizers and Zinc Sulphate will not be useful to the farmers at present and that the Farmers / Farmers' group have also represented to issue Relief as Cash subsidy instead of Relief Package. The Director of Agriculture has requested to consider and extend cash subsidy through Direct Benefit Transfer mode as per Chief Minister's announcement instead of distributing Relief Input Package for Paddy. Accordingly, as reported by the Director of Agriculture the above announced relief assistance has to be provided to the affected farmers as cash subsidy through Direct Benefit Transfer mode instead of relief package as detailed below:

Further, he has also stated that the Director of Agriculture has reported that crop loss has occurred to an extent of 2,256.56 Hectare to other than paddy, which includes sugarcane in an extent of 16.50 Hectare and coconut for an extent of 3.44 Hectare. He also informed that damages in respect of Coconut and Sugarcane will be assessed and relief assistance may be provided to the affected farmers after the receipt of final damage report on the above said crops. Accordingly, for early late pulses crops damages [Except Coconut and Sugarcane] to an extent of 2236.62 Hectares may be compensated by the way of providing inputs subsidy relief assistance @ Rs.3,000/- per Hectare on a proportionate rate as detailed below:-

Proposal – II [Horticultural crops]

The Director of Horticultural and plantation crops has reported that due to heavy rains during North East Monsoon 2021, Irrigated crops were damaged to an extent of 1,680.27 hectare and perennial crops to an extent of 114.82 hectare totaling 1,795.09 hectares of damage. He has informed that as per Sl.No.5(B) (d) r/w G.O (Ms) No. 380, Revenue and Disaster Management [D.M.III (2)] Department Dated: 27.10.2015 input subsidy where crop loss is 33% and above Rs.13,500/- per hectare for irrigated crops and Rs.18,000/- per hectare for perennial crops is eligible under State Disaster Response Fund . However, relief assistance may be provided at enhanced rate from SDRF and State fund detailed below:

6. The Government after careful consideration, accept the proposal of the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration and based on the approval of the State Executive Committee, accord sanction for a sum of Rs.35.09 Crore (Rupees Thirty Five crore and nine lakh only) from State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) to the Directors of Agriculture and Horticulture for Crop damages to Agricultural and Horticultural crops due to heavy rains during North East Monsoon 2021.

7. The Directors of Agriculture and Horticulture are directed to ensure that the para 3 (vi) above is fulfilled.

8. The amount sanctioned in paragraph 6 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

(i) Assistance for Agricultural Crop Loss:- Rs.32.62 Crore

"2245 Relief on account of Natural Calamities - 02 - Floods, Cyclones etc., 114 - Assistance to Farmers for purchase of Agricultural Inputs - State's Expenditure - AA Subsidy to Small and Marginal Farmers for Agricultural Inputs due to Flood -311 Subsidies 01 Individual Based Subsidy"

(ii) Assistance for Horticulture Crop Loss:- Rs.2.47 Crore

9. Necessary additional funds of Rs.35.09 crore will be provided in Revised Estimate/ Final Modified Appropriation 2021-2022. Pending provision of such funds, the Principal Secretary/ Commissioner of Revenue Administration is authorized to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 6 above. The expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislative Assembly by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2021-2022. He is also directed to include the above item of expenditure while sending Budget proposal of Revised Estimate/Final Modified Appropriation 2021-2022 and also send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2021-2022 to Finance (Revenue/BG-I) Department at an appropriate time without fail.
