1. INTRODUCTION

Disaster threatens sustainable economic development worldwide. In the past twenty years, earthquakes, floods, tropical storms, droughts and other calamities have killed millions of people, inflicted injury, disease and caused homelessness and misery to around one billion others in the world. Disaster is the occurrence of sudden or major misfortune which disrupts the basic fabric and normal functioning of a society. These have caused damage to infrastructure worth millions of Rupees. Disaster destroys decades of human effort and investments, thereby, placing new demands on society for re-construction and rehabilitation. Disaster management thus requires a multi-disciplinary and pro-active approach. The community, civil society organizations, media and the proverbial man on the street, everyone has to play a role in case such exigency occurs.

The DM Act 2005 defines “disaster” as;

“Disaster” means a catastrophe, mishap, calamity or grave occurrence in any area, arising from natural or manmade causes, or by accident or negligence which results in substantial loss of life or human suffering or damage to, and destruction of, property, or damage to, or degradation of environment, and is of such a nature or magnitude as to be beyond the coping capacity of the community of the affected area.”

WHY DISTRICT DISASTER MANAGEMENT PLAN IS NEEDED:

A disaster by definition is associated with unpredictability – one cannot really predict exactly where, when and with what intensity a disaster would strike. The mantra, therefore, is to be prepared for such an eventuality. The district is the highest administrative unit at the field level. The institution of the District Collector also provides the leadership required for an administrative area to work as a unit. This is, inter alia, the disaster management plan is prepared at the district level also to assess the vulnerability of district to various major hazards so that appropriate steps in the event of any disaster.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PLAN:

The objective of a Disaster Management Plan is to localize a Disaster and contain its effect to the greatest extent so as to minimize its impact on life, environment and property. Response to any disaster, in the absence of a well-defined plan, would be arbitrary, leading to overemphasis of some actions and absence of other critical actions. A formal plan for Managing Disaster is therefore necessary. This Disaster Management Plan has a strong preparedness focus which aims at reducing our vulnerability to disasters and at the same time, it includes a plan of action/response mechanism for dealing with floods, cyclones etc.

1. To assess various hazard, vulnerability, capacity and risk of the district.
2. To prescribe standard operating procedures and guidelines for disaster risk mitigation, preparedness and capacity building, relief and response, recovery and reconstruction.
3. To build the capacity of all stakeholders in the state to cope with the disasters and promote community-based DRR.
4. To provide clarity on roles and responsibilities for line departments and all stakeholders concerned in various phases of disaster management.
5. To ensure co-ordination and promote productive partnership with all other agencies related to disaster management.
6. To mainstream disaster management concerns into the developmental planning for DRR and climate change adaptation.
7. To ensure socially inclusive, gender sensitive, children centric and differently abled and vulnerable caring disaster response.
8. To develop efficient, streamlined and rapid disaster response and relief mechanism in the state.
9. To minimize adverse impact of disasters and reduce losses in lives, livelihoods, health, and assets (economic, physical, social, cultural and environmental).
10. To invest in DRR for resilience through structural, non-structural and financial measures, as well as comprehensive capacity development.
11. To take-up recovery programme as an opportunity to build back better by ensuring community participation in the programme.
12. To promote the implementation of integrated and inclusive economic, structural, legal, social, health, cultural, educational, environmental, technological, political and institutional measures to prevent and reduce hazard exposure and vulnerabilities to disaster.
13. To strengthen the disaster risk assessment through mapping, modeling, monitoring and by establishing multi-hazard early warning systems with last mile connectivity.
14. To establish partnership with academic, scientific and research institutions for effective use of science, technology for Disaster risk management.
15. To collaborate with the local community for harnessing the traditional knowledge and wisdom for sustainable disaster risk reduction.

PRINCIPLES OF DISASTER MANAGEMENT AND MITIGATION

The scope and magnitude of any disaster will determine who must deal with its consequences. The steps for dealing with all disasters, no matter their scale, follow the same basic format. The mantra during any disaster is “PREPARE, MITIGATE and MANAGE”.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

It includes all of the activities that are carried out prior to the advance notice of a catastrophe in order to facilitate the use of available resources, relief, and rehabilitation in the best possible fashion. Disaster preparedness starts at the local community level; if local resources were insufficient, it would branch out to higher levels.

MITIGATION

Actions to prevent an emergency from happening or lessen the impact if it does happen (i.e. flood plain management, building codes, land use planning, strapping water heaters, etc) are known as mitigation. This is the most crucial component in any disaster management exercise. It may be in the form of creating awareness, building long term or short-term infrastructure in hazard zones, aid planning, etc... Mitigation opportunities may arise any time where the awareness of the disaster is high, e.g., disaster scare-however unfounded it seems, post disaster, during disaster or during such seasons in areas prone to disasters. Attention to such opportunities can help in tackling any future emergencies.

Hazard Mitigation refers to sustained measures enacted to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards and their effects. In the long term, mitigation measures reduce personal loss, save lives, and reduce the cost to the nation of responding to and recovering from disasters.

RESPONSE

All emergencies require time-sensitive reaction and intervention to minimize loss of lives and property. It may involve reactions from different units working separately but in tandem. It involves immediate response to the situation, stabilization of the situation for regrouping of resources, and the taking up mitigation measures. It should result in short-term recovery, which ultimately sets the tone for a successful long-term recovery.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

It is the process of addressing an event that has the potential to seriously disrupt the social fabric of the community.

It is similar to disaster mitigation, however it implies a whole-of-government approach to using community resources to fight the effects of an event and assumes the community will be self-sufficient for periods of time until the situation can be stabilized.

Through disaster management, we cannot completely counteract the damage but it is possible to minimize the risks through early warning, provide developmental plans for

recuperation from the disaster, generate communication and medical resources, and aid in rehabilitation and post-disaster reconstruction.

The exchange of correct information following the event is important, in order to ensure the resources necessary to support response and recovery activities. The 72 hours following a major event is the most difficult time because of a lack of coordination among relief organizations. Problems that interrupt rather than coordinate the rescue efforts of all groups involved often occur because of hasty decision-making under complicated circumstances and the large number of organizations, which are unsure of their roles during operations.

RECOVERY:

It refers to actions to restore the community to pre-disaster conditions to the degree possible. Local and State governments share the responsibility for protecting their citizens from disasters, and for helping them to recover when a disaster strikes. It may mean providing basic human needs like food, clothing, and shelter, establishing necessary lifeline systems like power, communication, transportation and ensuring societal needs of rule of law, sanitation, etc, rebuilding confidence, etc.,

DISASTER PREVENTION

It is concerned with policies and programs to prevent the recurrence of natural disasters and covers the long-term aspect of such disasters. The small price to pay for any method of prevention and protection pays off in the long run.

Any disaster prevention strategy will essentially have to have two main components:

- to increase public awareness of natural hazard risk and
- to reduce significantly the risk of the loss of life, injury, economic cost, and destruction of natural and cultural resources due to natural disasters.

In this, five key elements are essential:

1. hazard identification and risk assessment;
2. applied research and technology transfer;
3. public awareness training and education;
4. incentives and resources;
5. leadership and co-ordination.

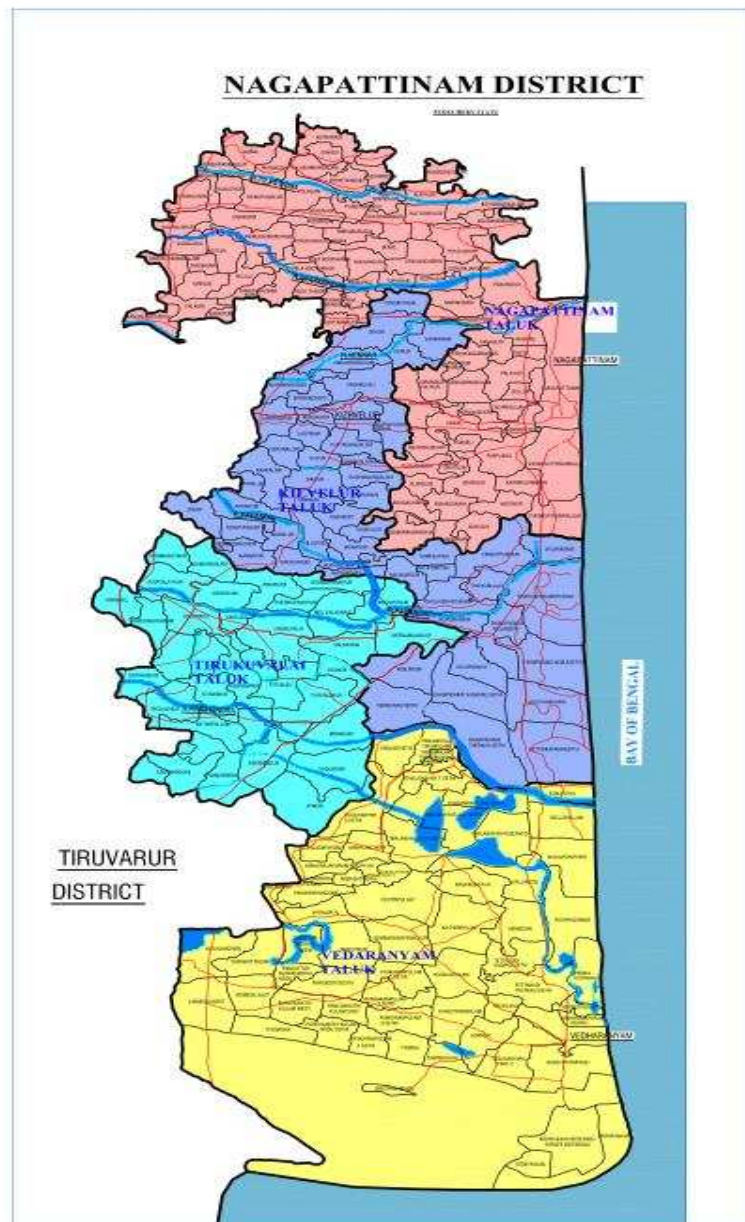
Through these plans, the way relief organizations and the communities deal with disasters will be improved. As the population increases, it is expected that economic and societal costs of disasters will increase every year. The need to prevent property damage, disaster costs, injury and deaths is increasing because with increasing population more and more people will live and work in regions of natural disaster risks. With the established and anticipated disaster

programs, communities can prepare and recover faster, however we must not forget the severity of any disaster and we must remember to be prepared for all of them.

2. DISTRICT PROFILE:

Nagapattinam district, which came in to existence from 1991 is situated Coastal District of Tamil Nadu and is bounded by Bay of Bengal on the East, the Palk strait on the South, the Tiruvarur, Thanjavur Districts in west, the Karaikal District in Pondicherry (UT) on the North. It is located between latitudes N 10.10' and 11.20' and longitudes E 79.15' and 79.50'. The total geographical area of Nagapattinam District is 1399.7 Sq Kms, i.e. 1.08% of Tamil Nadu.

The Head Quarters of Nagapattinam District is Nagapattinam. Nagapattinam District comprises of Two Divisions, Four Revenue Taluks, Six Blocks, Two Municipalities and four Town Panchayats.

CLIMATE AND RAIN FALL

The climate of the Nagapattinam District is generally warm. The hottest period of the year is generally from the months of March to May, the highest temperature going up to 40.6 C in April. The Climate becomes cool in December and continuous so up to February, touching a minimum of 19.30 C in January. On an average the District receives an annual rainfall of 1230 mm.

3. DISASTER MANAGEMENT GOALS (2018-2030)

TAMIL NADU SYSTEM FOR MULTI-HAZARD POTENTIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT ANDEMERGENCY RESPONSE TRACKING (TN -SMART)

The Government of Tamil Nadu had put in place a System for Multi-Hazard Potential Impact Assessment and Emergency Response Tracking (SMART). The TN SMART has been developed in collaboration with the Regional Integrated Multi- Hazard Early Warning System for Africa and Asia (RIMES) an Inter-Governmental Organization registered with the United Nations based in Bangkok. This system will be integrated with the other systems being developed with the help of GIS technology. TN SMART offers the following services to strengthen risk governance.

- A dynamic risk assessment system to assess the potential impacts of the weather forecast issued by India Meteorology Department.
- An ensemble forecasting platform comprising of forecast products from various global and regional center for reference purposes.
- A robust verification mechanism (meta- analysis) platform to critically evaluate the performance of all the forecast products and forecast based impact scenarios, a “real-time system of evaluating the predictions with reference to the actual situations”.

TN-SMART initiative is in line with World Meteorological Organization’s Global Framework for Climate Services, i.e. development and application of climate services to assist decision- making for addressing climate-related risks.

Risk assessment and impact assessment components are driven by the forecast and site- specific thresholds derived from the historical records of extreme events and hazards. The tool would capture the risk and the corresponding potential impact. NDEM (National Database for Emergency Management) developed by the National Remote Sensing Center (NRSC) which has inbuilt national level GIS datasets will be integrated with State Data Base for Emergency Management (SDEM) & TN-SMART. The TN-SMART will assist in Forecast and Analysis, Risk mapping and assessment, also act as a data management system for managing and processing weather, disaster risks and emergency response resources data for use during the different phases of disasters.

RISK COMMUNICATION

Communicating risks to the community plays a very critical role in minimizing the risk of loss of lives and moveable properties. Dissemination of information in time is a major challenge requiring investments in State of the art technologies. Government of Tamilnadu being committed to minimize loss of lives and damages to public and private properties will strengthen risk communication by embracing new technologies besides strengthening existing technologies as noted below.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Social Media will be utilized for information gathering and information dissemination in short notice. Social Media will be used extensively in disseminating Forecast, Early Warning Alerts and Messages to evacuate to avoid disaster mapping of disaster prone zones as well as in crowd management during Pre Disaster, during Disaster and post Disaster Phases.

STRENGTHENING OF EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTRES FOR REAL-TIME RISK COMMUNICATION

Flood Control Rooms will be strengthened at District Emergency Operation Centre at District Collectorate. New tools for Risk assessment will be utilized for generating vital information during pre-disaster and during disaster phases to effectively communicate the risks to community as early as possible. The DEOC is equipped with multi communication facilities like VHF, mobile telephone etc. The Government will strive to establish EOCs at Taluk & Sub-Taluk Levels and make communication in the EOCs at all levels from the State to local level, disaster proof by adding wireless communication sets Internet telephony, Ham radios, satellite radio etc., so that communication is uninterrupted even during power outages.

EOC FOR SUB DIVISIONS, TALUKS AND SUB-TALUKS

When distress calls are received from the community, government help should be close and fast. At present, EOCs have been established at State, District Headquarters and Coastal Sub Divisions.

With the burgeoning population, it is important to decentralize the EOCs further. Hence, it is envisaged that full fledged Emergency operation centres would be opened even at the Taluk level and Sub Taluk Level. Thus, disaster will be managed at micro level giving due importance to location, local culture etc.

EARLY WARNING SYSTEM (EWS)

Tamil Nadu has made a huge progress during post Tsunami period in terms of getting real time information on weather events and seismic activities. The District has a well equipped District Emergency Operations Centre (DEOC) that gets information on significant events from various agencies and presently disseminates information through multiple channels to the DEOs which in turn inform to various line departments and first responders and the communities. However, limitation of the present system of information is that the dissemination from district level to the community in remote location gets delayed due to absence of an integrated information dissemination system.

The Cyclone Warning Centre at the Meteorological Department in Chennai usually communicates the cyclone warnings through the 'Disaster Warning Systems' installed at the following offices:

SATELLITE TELEPHONE

The satellite connection do not depend on land-based telephone wires or cellular towers and are capable of providing a full range of communications services, including voice, video and broadband data. Even when disasters strike, these networks can be used to provide seismic and flood sensing data to Government agencies, to enable early warning of an impending situation and broadcast disaster-warning alerts and facilitate general communication and information flow between Government agencies, relief organizations and the public.

TAMIL NADU DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (TNDRF)

Though the community always acts as a first responder during disasters that strike with limited warning time as well as during disasters which can be forecast at least 20-24 hours prior to the event, the role of specially trained disaster response forces will be extremely vital for quick and before time evacuation of the people likely to be affected as well as for efficient search and rescue in case of necessity. Realizing the importance and significance of Special Forces, Government of Tamil Nadu raised an exclusive battalion as Tamil Nadu Disaster Response Force and has also provided Rs.15 crores for procurement of State of the art Search, Rescue and Evacuation equipment. The SDRF personnel after being equipped with skills on par with NDRF will also be engaged in training young recruits (to the Police, Fire Services and other specialized services) in Search, Rescue and Evacuation operations. The SDRF personnel will also be utilized to train the First Responders identified from among the community, especially in the vulnerable areas.

The disaster response force will be equipped in a phased manner with modern technology like unmanned aerial vehicles, robots etc., which will be used in the following ways:

- High Antennas for Radio Communications- Tethered Drone (HARC-TD)
- HARC-Tethered Drone for improved network and communications range extension for tactical radio communicators, first responders and similar users of mission-critical radio networks.
- UAVs with sensor options such as visual, thermal, LiDAR etc. will be procured for use to map disaster areas, generate high-resolution and 3D mapping, identify hot spot areas and upload the data in real time to coordinate search, rescue and evacuation efforts during natural disasters as well as industrial disasters.

FIRE& RESCUE SERVICES

Fire and Rescue Services Department is entrusted with the task of firefighting and rescue operations in times of emergency. They play a very vital role in the area of firefighting and fire prevention. Apart from firefighting, this department also undertakes rescue activities

and helps people, marooned in floods and caught in the debris of fallen buildings, road and rail accidents and other natural and man-made disasters.

Fully automated fire fighting futuristic equipment and Robots will be playing a major role in the years to come. A conscious effort will be made to procure such modern systems equipped with thermal sensors to help in detecting fire at the earliest possible time and strengthen the fire-dousing operations.

INTERDEPARTMENTAL ZONAL TEAMS FOR GROUP OF VULNERABLE AREAS

Interdepartmental Zonal Teams are formed under the leadership of Revenue Authority. The team members are drawn from Police, Fire services, Rural Development, Forest, Agriculture Departments etc. Each team will closely monitor 5 to 7 vulnerable areas. 8 Interdepartmental zonal teams are formed to monitor the vulnerable areas. The capacity of the members of the Interdepartmental Zone teams will be enhanced and they will be equipped with equipment to reach out to the community and quickly evacuate them based on early warning alerts communicated to them.

FIRST RESPONDERS

Community participation at grass root level is enabled through enrolment of able-bodied volunteers, with skills of swimming and climbing, as first responders. First responder teams are formed in Areas of very high and high vulnerability. The first responders are trained by Fire services/SDRF and Red Cross society. Mobile teams of First Responders and Snake Catchers at Block/Taluk/Sub-Divisional and District levels are formed for deployment based on need.

The First Responders play a key role in organizing (first aid, search and rescue, extrication from damaged buildings, road clearance, firefighting) raising awareness (about hazards, risks, disaster response) community drills (annual drills for disaster response in the community) equipping the community with minimum resources (first aid kit, extrication equipment, lifejackets, lifebuoys, rope and the like). In the years to come, they will be trained regularly to enhance their skills on the one hand and more volunteers will be enrolled on the other.

LOCAL SELF GOVERNMENTS

The Urban/Rural local bodies, Town/ Village Panchayat have a key role in prevention & Mitigation and Preparedness of disasters. The DDMA's will coordinate the functions of these local bodies at the district level. The elected representatives will be sensitized to the needs of the community during disasters and their capacities will be strengthened through orientation and other training programmes.

INCIDENT RESPONSE SYSTEM

The management of response in disasters requires the Government, Community, civil society and other stakeholders to carry out a large number of tasks. The activities involved in response management would depend on the nature and type of disaster. The District is adopting Incident Response System (IRS) in the State to ensure the unification of efforts of all the stakeholders to ensure immediate response during disasters to protect people & their properties.

The Incident Response System provides a systematic, proactive approach guiding the concerned departments and agencies at all levels of Government, the private sector and Non-Governmental organizations to work seamlessly in disaster situations. For effective, efficient and comprehensive management of disasters in the district, IRS is critical. The aim is not only to minimize loss of life and property but also to strengthen and standardize the disaster response mechanism in the State.

The District Collector is the overall RESPONSIBLE OFFICER and is assisted by the Revenue and Disaster Management Department. During Disasters all Line Departments function under the overall guidance of the Incident Commander. The District Collector is otherwise the Incident Commander.

INVESTING IN DISASTER RISK REDUCTION FOR RESILIENCE

Efforts are being undertaken for disaster risk prevention and reduction through structural and non-structural measures to enhance the economic, social, health and cultural resilience/resistance of persons, communities and the State's assets, as well as the environment. This will further encourage the involvement of the community, civil societies and the Private sector to partner the Government in its efforts to transform vulnerable areas to resilient areas. This will also promote

- Tools for incorporating disaster risk considerations in cost-benefit analysis, budgetary tools and information systems.
- Sector based guidelines for the implementation of disaster risk management policies for public investment.
- Guidelines for the evaluation of investment projects, including tools and requirements for disaster risk management and climate change adaptation analysis in addition to Environmental Impact Analysis and compliance to regulatory requirements in fragile ecosystems and other general regulations.
- Tools for analyzing natural hazards in public investment projects.
- Developing and enforcing risk analysis criteria in private and public investment system regulations.
- Compendium of best practices

The Local bodies will be encouraged and incentivized to allocate necessary resources, including finance and logistics at the village level for the development and the implementation of disaster risk reduction strategies policies, plans and regulations in all relevant sectors with the active participation of the community and collaboration with different stakeholders. The Local Bodies will also be encouraged to promote the mainstreaming of disaster risk assessment, mapping and management into rural development planning and management of, inter alia, rivers, coastal flood plain areas-in coastal villages, hill areas, drylands, wetlands and all other areas prone to droughts and flooding, including preserving ecosystem functions that help reduce risks.

RISK TRANSFER

The District will continue to promote mechanisms for disaster risk transfer and insurance risk sharing for both public and private investment with special focus on Farmers and Livestock Farmers in order to reduce the financial impact of disasters especially during cyclonic storms, floods and drought. Special efforts will be made to enroll all the farmers in the areas identified as vulnerable to different disasters. The Risk coverage for all will be aimed

at universal enrollment especially in the agricultural & allied sectors, fisheries along with coverage of their assets.

INVOLVEMENT OF PRIVATE SECTOR

The private sector will be brought together on a common platform to strengthen disaster resilient investments, particularly through: structural, non- structural and functional disaster risk prevention and reduction measures in Vulnerable areas and in critical facilities and building better from the start to withstand hazards through proper design and construction, including the use of the principles of design innovation and the standardization of building codes and materials; retrofitting and rebuilding; and taking into account economic social, structural, technological and environmental impact assessments.

NON-STRUCTURAL MEASURES

As part of the non-structural measures, the district will promote the mainstreaming of disaster risk assessments into land use policy development and implementation, including urban planning, land degradation assessments and housing for the poor and the use of guidelines taking into account anticipated demographic and environmental changes. The district will also encourage the adoption of National building codes and standards, rehabilitation and reconstruction practices.

SOCIAL INCLUSION

Government of Tamil Nadu is known for welfare policies and is a pioneer in protecting and promoting the interests of the vulnerable sections be it women, weaker sections, children or differently abled. The design and implementation of inclusive policies and social safety-net mechanisms will be further strengthened, including community involvement, integration of livelihood enhancement programmes, access to basic health care services, including maternal, newborn and child health, sexual and reproductive health, food security and nutrition, housing and education and find durable solutions in the post-disaster phase to empower and assist people (currently) disproportionately affected by disasters to be resistant to risks.

MAINSTREAMING RISK CONCERNS A WAY OF DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Mainstreaming Disaster Risk Reduction' into developmental plans strengthens risk reduction strategies by ensuring that new projects will incorporate measures to reduce existing risks and will ensure that new risks do not arise due to implementation of the new projects.

- On-going schemes and projects of Departments of Government of India and Government of Tamil Nadu as well as of all Government agencies and

Institutions, including Public Sector Undertakings, will be mandated to mainstream disaster risks into the schemes and projects for ensuring that they address the disaster risk and vulnerabilities of the local areas and enhance the capacity of the community to resist disaster risks.

- At conceptualization or funding stage itself, the developmental schemes will be designed taking into consideration potential hazards associated with it and incorporate measures for mitigation of the same.

- First Responders including Women in Vulnerable areas.

- Restoration and protection of fragile coastal and wetland ecosystems
- Prevention of Sea water intrusion
- Enhanced storage of water bodies through effective management of water bodies
- Conversion of over exploited and critical aquifers into safe categories
- Enhancement of bio-shields in coastal ecosystems
- Promotion of sustainable Agricultural practices in Rain fed areas for drought and climate mitigation.

Non Structural Measures

- Risk Transfer (enlarging Insurance cover – Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bhima Yojana)
- Encouraging Private Participation (Corporate Social Responsibility)
- Disaster Risk Reduction to become a new norm in all developmental projects

Thus, as part of a Perspective Disaster Management plan for 2030, it is planned to develop a technology driven, community led, multi-dimensional approach to Disaster

Management which can also act as a template for emerging situations in the future.

4. HAZARD, RISK AND VULNERABILITY ANALYSIS

1. HAZARD

INTRODUCTION

Disasters may be classified into five major types:-

- Water and Climate related disaster.
- Geologically related disaster.
- Chemical, Industrial and Nuclear disasters.
- Accident related disaster.
- Biologically related disaster.

To prepare any plan to prevent, mitigate or respond to any disaster, an analysis must be done to identify the disasters that the district is prone to Nagapattinam district is prone to all the above types of disasters but to a different degree to each. Given its topography and location, the district is prone to frequent climatic and water related disasters prevail throughout the district. As far as geological disasters are concerned the district does not lie in the geologically sensitive areas. However, as experienced in Latur, it cannot be predicted as to when and where such disasters would strike. Hazards to accident related disasters are limited to areas with road and rail networks and chemical and industrial related disasters hazards are also localized to where the industries are located.

WATER AND CLIMATE RELATED DISASTER

Cyclones

Nagapattinam district has a long coastline of about 188 Kms along the often-turbulent Bay of Bengal. Thus the district is highly prone to cyclone. Cyclones have hit seven times in the last 50 years. Cyclones are associated with the North East Monsoon Season. Therefore, whenever there is depression, there are cyclonic formations in the Bay of Bengal which results in rains in the coastal areas, ranging from light to heavy rains to major cyclonic storms. Nagapattinam district falls under the very High Damage Risk Zone – as clear from wind and cyclone hazard.

A tropical cyclone is a huge rotating mass of moist air in the form of a rotating disc. It is associated with spiral cloud bands that cause very heavy precipitation. Cyclones over the Indian seas are moderate in size and lasts about 4-5 days in the post monsoon months (October – November) which are short-lived as compared to systems over the Pacific or the Atlantic. On an average, about seven cyclones occur annually over the NIO (the Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea). Of these, 2 to 3 develop into Very Severe Cyclone stage with hurricane force. The ratio of Tropical Cyclones over the Bay of Bengal and the Arabian Sea is 4:1

Tropical cyclones move as a whole body, and usually change directions. It gains momentum and the ring of violent winds enters a land area where the cyclone weakens. However the rainfall may continue for a day or two over the area traversed by the cyclone. It is difficult to forecast the precise location and direction of movement of individual cyclones.

Classification

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) classifies the tropical disturbance on the basis of maximum sustained winds. Though systems are found to rapidly intensity they never change their intensity by more than two stages at any point of time. The following table summarizes the classification scheme adopted by the IMD.

EFFECTS

Storm Surge

Storm surge is the term used to denote the rapid rise in the sea level associated with a cyclone. It occurs along the seacoast to the right of the tract of the cyclone, a few hours before the cyclone strikes the coast. A sea level rise of 2 to 3 metres is common but with very severe cyclones the rise can be 5 metres or more. The risen sea inundates the low-lying land areas of the coast drowning human and livestock, eroding beaches and embankments, destroying vegetation, increasing salinity, reducing soil fertility and causing contamination of drinking water.

Storm surge depends on the intensity of the system, Bathymetry (bottom topography of the seacoast), coastal configuration and the angle at which the cyclone strikes the coast. Vulnerability to storm surges is not uniform along the Indian coast. The following segments of the east coast are most vulnerable to high surges.

North Orissa and West Bengal Coasts.

Andhra Pradesh coast between Ongole and Machilipatnam.

Tamilnadu Coast south of Nagapattinam.

Gales

Gales are very strong winds which may cause damages to installations and structures, dwellings, communication system and trees resulting in loss of life and property.

Rain fall

Tropical cyclones give abundant rainfall. Heavy and prolonged rain spell may cause river-floods, which may submerge low-lying areas, cause erosion of structures, washing away of bridges, rail-tracks and roads.

About 90% of rainfall is limited within 200 kms radius of the cyclone and between 200-500 kms less than 10% of the rainfall occurs. Rainfall maximum occurs in left forward sector for westward moving systems. For cyclones affecting east coast the belt of heavy rainfall extends more to the north than to the south.

Cyclone Warning Forecast

Majority of tropical cyclones are associated with some sort of abnormal behaviour and therefore difficult to be precisely predicted. However, Satellite pictures of cloud features of tropical cyclones reveal the cyclones and their intensity. These pictures therefore help in monitoring the nature, movement and the behavior of the cyclones. When cyclones are tracked by Radar, short-term forecasts of cyclone movement 6 to 12 hours ahead become quite precise. Advance indications of change of course of the Cyclone towards north or northeast, 24 hours ahead, are sometimes available.

Monitoring the cyclones within 400 km of the coast is greatly facilitated by Cyclone Detection Radar (S-band). There are 10 CDRs in our country, of 6 along the east coast at Karaikal, Chennai, Machlipatnam, Visakhapatnam, Paradip and Calcutta; and 4 along the west coast at Kochi, Goa, Mumbai and Bhuj .

A forecast is adjudged as successful for appropriate preparedness and decision making if actual landfall occurs within 100 km to the left or right of predicted landfall point. This is the approximate length of the coastline that may be considered liable to the severe destructive force of an intense tropical cyclone.

Floods and Flood Hazard Management

Nagapattinam is a flood prone area. Large number of rivers and big water bodies make the district highly prone to flood. Besides being a coastal area, it is also a tail-end area through which the Cauvery river system drains into the sea. The landscape has a gradual slop from west to east and from north to south slopes. The mild land slopes makes drainage difficult. Low lying areas and coastal areas have floods during the period of heavy rains particularly during North East Monsoon period.

Flood plains

Flooding is a common hazard as a result of heavy rainfall (flash floods), cyclonic rains, or even tidal waves when a water course overflows its banks, floodplains store the water until it is able to move downstream or be absorbed into the ground. Flooding is a natural event that replenishes the groundwater and revitalizes the soil through the deposit of sediments.

Reducing Flood Threats

Reducing flood damage and disruption are important concerns for the district administration and communities . Flood damage can be reduced by engineering works (dikes), flood-proofing techniques, pre-flood planning initiatives and post-flood emergency measures. Engineering works, such as dams and dikes, do reduce the risk of flood damage. However, during severe floods dike failure may occur due to erosion, overtopping or seepage and flooding will occur. It is impractical, and beyond our economic means, to eliminate all flood damage with dams and dikes.

Reducing Flood Damage:

The most effective method of reducing the risk of flood damage would be the regulation development on the floodplain. This requires the co-operation of all levels of government, developers, builders, realtors and the public. Land-use decisions by local governments must take into account flood risks to ensure that development occurs on the least hazardous lands. However, systematic regulation of floodplains is lacking due to the high pressure on land for cultivation.

The purpose of the Flood Hazard Management is to ensure public safety and protection of property through:

1. increased public awareness of flood hazards;
2. establishment of flood proofing standards for new development;
3. local government land-use planning;

4. regulation of subdivision approvals.

Drought

Drought is a period or condition of unusually dry weather within a geographic area where rainfall is normally present. During a drought there is a lack of precipitation. Droughts occur in all climatic zones. However, its characteristics vary significantly from one region to another.

Drought usually results in a water shortage that seriously interferes with human activity. Water-supply reservoirs empty, wells dry up, and crop damage ensues. Its seriousness depends on the degree of the water shortage, size of area affected, and the duration and warmth of the dry period. In countries like ours, people place a great demand on water supply. During a drought period there is a lack of water, and thus many of the poor die.

Most precipitation depends on water vapor carried by winds from an ocean or other source of moisture. If these moisture-carrying winds are replaced by winds from a dry region, or if they are modified by downward motion, as in the center of an anticyclone, the weather is abnormally dry and often persistently cloudless. If the drought period is short, it is known as a dry spell. A dry spell is usually more than 14 days without precipitation, whereas a severe drought may last for years. Although drought cannot be reliably predicted, certain precautions can be taken in drought-risk areas. These include construction of reservoirs to hold emergency water supplies, education to avoid over-cropping and overgrazing, and programs to limit settlement in drought-prone areas.

Countless numbers of droughts have been recorded throughout history. Nearly every nation has endured a major drought and has suffered from the effects of the drought. Overpopulated areas that experience little annual rainfall, such as India, are in constant danger of drought. Drought represents one of the most important natural triggers for malnutrition and famine, a significant and widespread problem in many parts of Africa and in other countries as well. At least a quarter of the world's population lives in such areas where drought hinders the nation's stability and development.

Effects of Drought

Drought produces a large number of impacts that affects the social, environmental, and economical standard of living. Its affects spread far beyond the physical effects of drought itself. Water is integral to produce goods and provide certain services. Some direct impacts of drought are reduced crop, rangeland, and forest productivity; reduced water levels; increased fire hazard; increased livestock and wildlife death rates; and damage to wildlife and fish

habitat. A reduction in crop productivity usually results in less income for farmers, increased prices for food, unemployment, and migration.

The many effects of drought can be listed as *economic, environmental, or social*. However, not all impacts of drought are negative. Fortunate agricultural producers located outside the drought area benefit by selling their goods at higher prices.

Drought is also associated with increases in insect infestations, plant disease, and wind erosion. Droughts may cause problems with insects and diseases to forests. Forest fires increase dramatically during periods of droughts

Farmers are not the only ones who suffer from droughts. Retailers who provide goods and services to farmers must deal with reduced business. This later leads to unemployment and loss of tax revenue for the government. The recreational and tourism industries are seriously damaged because tourists do not want to travel to a country that is suffering from a severe water shortage. Shortages of certain goods results in the costly importation of necessary goods from outside the affected area.

Environmental losses are caused by damages to plant and animal species. Wildlife habitat and air and water quality are usually damaged due to a lack of water and an increase in forest and range fires. Most of the effects of drought are short-term, and as the drought comes to an end many problems are solved. However, many other environmental effects hinder the area for long periods after the drought is over. For example, wildlife habitat may be ruined through the loss of wetlands, lakes, and vegetation. Some species of animals may be wiped out from the area as well.

Other drought-related impacts include social impacts. Social impacts include health, public safety, conflicts between water users, and reduced quality of life. During droughts many people migrate to areas outside the drought-affected location. When this happens, the area loses a great deal of its population, and thus the area has less financial support.

Meteorological Drought

Meteorological drought is the amount of dryness and the duration of the dry period. Atmospheric conditions that result in deficiencies of precipitation change from area to area.

Agricultural Drought

Agricultural drought mainly effects food production and farming. Agricultural drought and precipitation shortages bring soil water deficits, reduced ground water or reservoir levels, and so on. More of these effects can be listed by clicking [here](#). Deficient topsoil moisture at planting may stop germination, leading to low plant populations.

Hydrological Drought

Hydrological drought is associated with the effects of periods of precipitation shortages on water supply. Water in hydrologic storage systems such as reservoirs and rivers are often used for multiple purposes such as flood control, irrigation, recreation, navigation, hydropower, and wildlife habitat. Competition for water in these storage systems escalates during drought and conflicts between water users increase significantly.

Socio-economic Drought

Socioeconomic drought occurs when the demand for an economic good exceeds supply as a result of a weather-related shortfall in water supply. The supply of many economic goods, such as water, forage, food grains, fish, and hydroelectric power, depends on weather. Due to variability of climate, water supply is sufficient in some years but not satisfactory to meet human and environmental needs in other years. The demand for economic goods is increasing as a result of increasing population. Supply may also increase because of improved production efficiency and technology.

The analysis of rain fall date suggest that the district is not highly prone to drought. Although the vagaries of the Monsoons always pose a threat, the district has well laid irrigation network and good ground water potential.

Geologically Related Disaster

This district falls in the Zone – II of Earth Quake Hazard zones of India with the low damage zone as depicted in Map No.5.5. Therefore, the district is not prone to Earth Quake Hazard. There is no hilly region in the district. Therefore, the hazard of landslide is absent in the district.

Chemical And Industrial Related Disasters

There are oil companies operating in the district. Therefore, there is possibility of chemical and industrial hazard around these industries and the offsite emergency plan have been incorporated in the Disaster Management Plan.

ACCIDENT RELATED DISASTER

Road Accident Related Disaster

Different roadways criss cross the district and road accidents can never be ruled out. The hazard is therefore always present. It may not assume disastrous proportions but it is a hazard to which the population is most exposed. The district is traversed by the National Highways NH-45 through Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam Taluks and another National Highways NH-45-A or “East Coast Road” from Sirkazhi to Vedaranyam Taluks.

The length of the National Highways and State Highways, major district roads and other district roads in Nagapattinam district are furnished below:

i) National Highways	: 71.2 km
ii) State highways	: 115.75 km.
iii) Major district roads	: 190.4 km.
iv) Other district roads	: 902.735 km

On an average 650 accidents are reported every year and it is maintaining a rising trend. The accident-prone spots and stretches have been identified and based on the risk assessments faced during the earlier accidents in the district; the accident disaster plan has been prepared.

Train Accident disaster

The district is connected to the railway network via two metre gauge railway routes viz., the Nagore – Thiruvapur – Mayilathudurai - Chennai and the Nagore - Quilon route: But the district is traversed by only 66 Kms of railway line.

No major Train accident has been reported in the district in the recent past. But incidents of derailment / hold up of trains have been reported by the Railway Authorities during the last few years, which implies that the risk can never be ruled out.

Fire Accident Related Disaster

About half of the district population lives in thatched houses in the District. On an average 650 fire accidents per year are reported. The fire accident plan deals with the measures to be taken when there are reports received about fire accidents.

In the urban areas, there are possibilities of fire accidents taking place in buildings where congregations of large number of public such as Cinema Theaters, Marriage Halls etc.

Biologically Related Disaster

In this category two hazards namely cattle epidemics, food poisoning has been identified as the major hazard. Nagapattinam District has a total cattle population is about 8,53,172. There are 4,62,978 goat and sheeps 83,108 dogs and poultry figure is 4,02,045 according to cattle census 2005. There is considerable loss of cattles when Tsunami waves hit coastal villages.

There are 1094 Noon Meal Centres and 862 Anganwadi Centres in the district where the Mid Day Meals has been given to school going children, to the expected mother and young children and the aged. Similarly on occasions of festivals and marriages, big community kitchens are being organized. These kitchens are prone to food poisoning.

Tsunami Related Disaster

In the latest, Tsunami waves hit the coastal belt of Tamil Nadu from Chennai to Kanyakumari, Andhaman Nicobar Islands, Sri Lanka due to the under sea earthquake near Sumatra and Indonesia, which resulted in heavy loss of human life, cattles and damage to public and private properties.

2. RISK ANALYSIS

Risk Analysis for Nagapattinam District

As stated above, cyclone and flood are the two major natural hazards, which affect the District often. Tsunami waves are another hazard which often threatens the people of coastal areas often when earthquake hits the eastern area of Bay of Bengal. Other hazards though important are more localized in nature. Hence Risk analysis is done for cyclone and flood hazard in this chapter.

Hazard Assessment:

Thus assessment of hazard is the first logical step towards the Disaster Management.

Cyclones:

As already stated, cyclones are one of the two main hazards Nagapattinam district is facing. The district is situated on the East coast of India in Bay of Bengal which is known to be an active bed for cyclones. It is evident from the fact that in the Bay of Bengal, 99 severe cyclonic storms out of a total 295 cyclonic storms have been observed compared to only 38 total cyclonic storms observed in Arabian Sea of which 21 were severe cyclonic storms during last century. Cyclonic storms in Bay of Bengal are more common during the summer months of May and June, and, during the North East Monsoon months of October, November and December. During the 1891 – 1990 periods, maximum numbers of cyclones were formed in the month of November followed by those in October and those in the month of May. The following tables will illustrate the frequency of occurrence cyclones in this part of the state.

Floods

Being a coastal District with a few number of rivers and many major water tanks for irrigation purpose with very gradually sloping land, Nagapattinam District is prone to floods in the low lying areas, in coastal area and areas near adjoining rivers and major water tanks. Added to this area the cyclonic rains which take place mainly during the North East Monsoon months of October, November and December.

Almost every year, some of the villages face inundation in low-lying areas. Sometimes it necessitates evacuation of people to some Government buildings on high ground level till such time the floodwater recedes. The district faced last major floods in the year 1993.

Other Categories of Hazards

Other important hazards which are localized in nature can be categorized as:

- ✓ Chemical Industrial Hazard in CPCL, Panagudi and ONGC oil drills.
- ✓ Torrent CNG Gas Station at Seeyathamangai (Thirumarugal), Nagapattinam Taluk.
- ✓ Road and Train Accidents
- ✓ Fire Accidents

4. VULNERABILITY ANALYSIS

The Vulnerable are identified on based on the following norms:

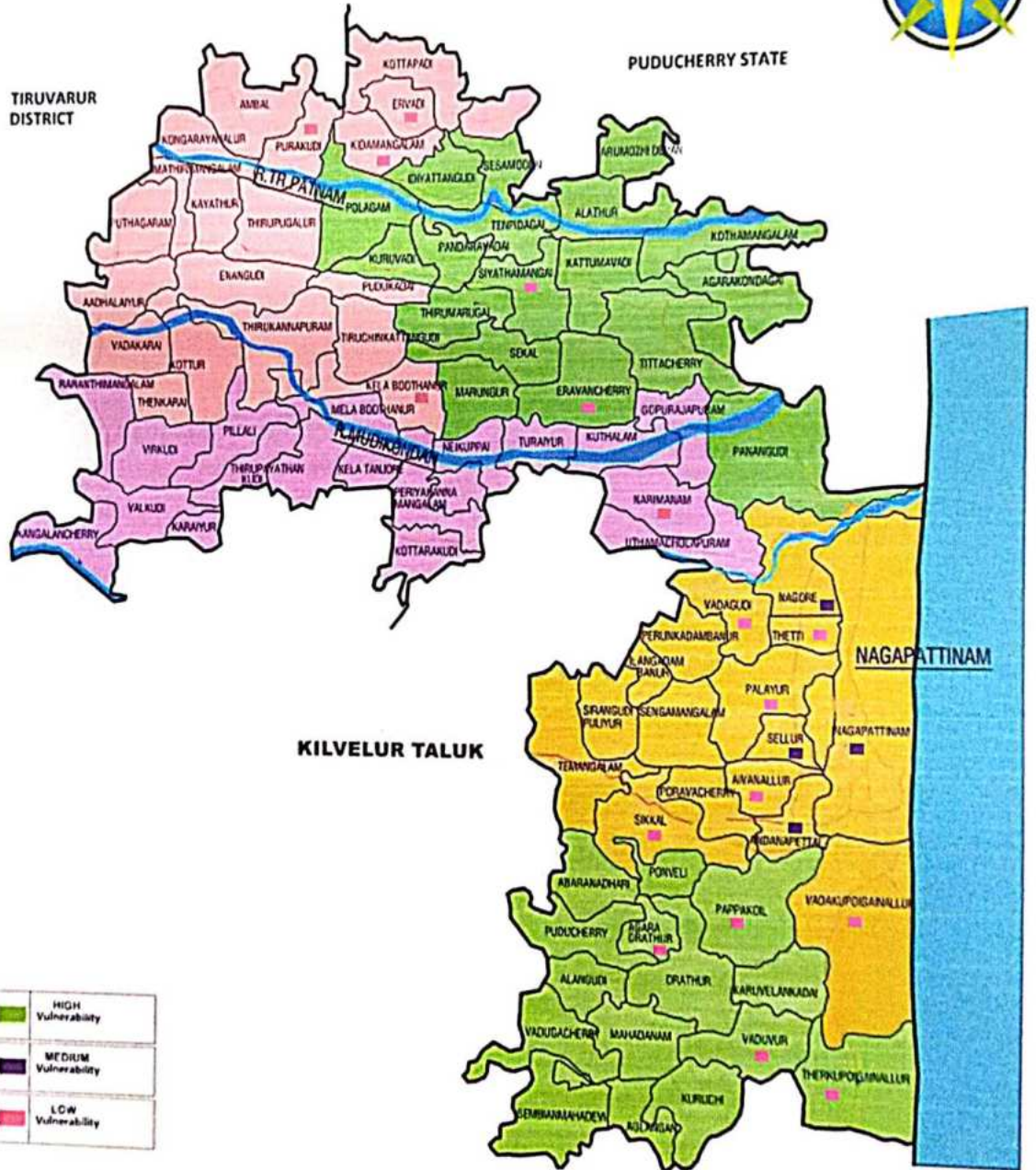
1. An area can be classified as Highly Vulnerable if any of the following criteria is satisfied
 - a. Inundation of water and water level was more than 5 feet due to heavy rains or discharge from water bodies.
 - b. Rescue operations carried out with the help of Central forces/SDRF
© Areas which are cutoff and became inaccessible for undertaking rescue and relief operations.
 - c. Loss of lives or large scale evacuation carried out.

2. An area can be classified as Vulnerable if any of the following criteria is satisfied
 - a. Inundation of water and water level was 3-5 feet.
 - b. Rescue operations carried out only by local police or Fire services and local community.

3. An area can be classified as Moderately Vulnerable if Inundation of Water & Water level was 2-3 feet.

4. An area can be classified as Less Vulnerable if stagnation of water was below 2 feet. The location may be grouped as Village Panchayat/Town Panchayat/ Municipalities and Corporation (except Chennai)

NAGAPATTINAM DISTRICT NAGAPATTINAM TALUK MAP

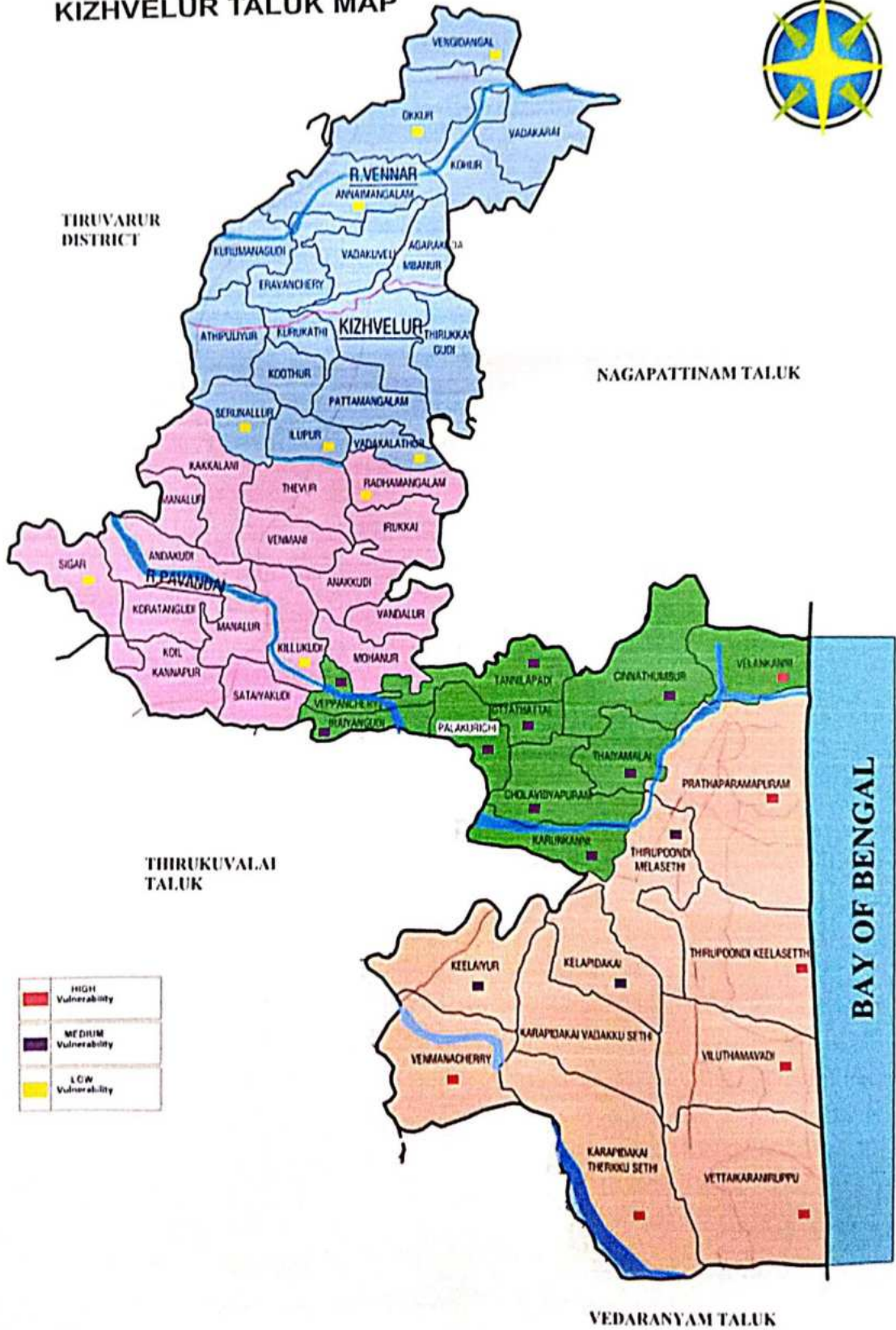

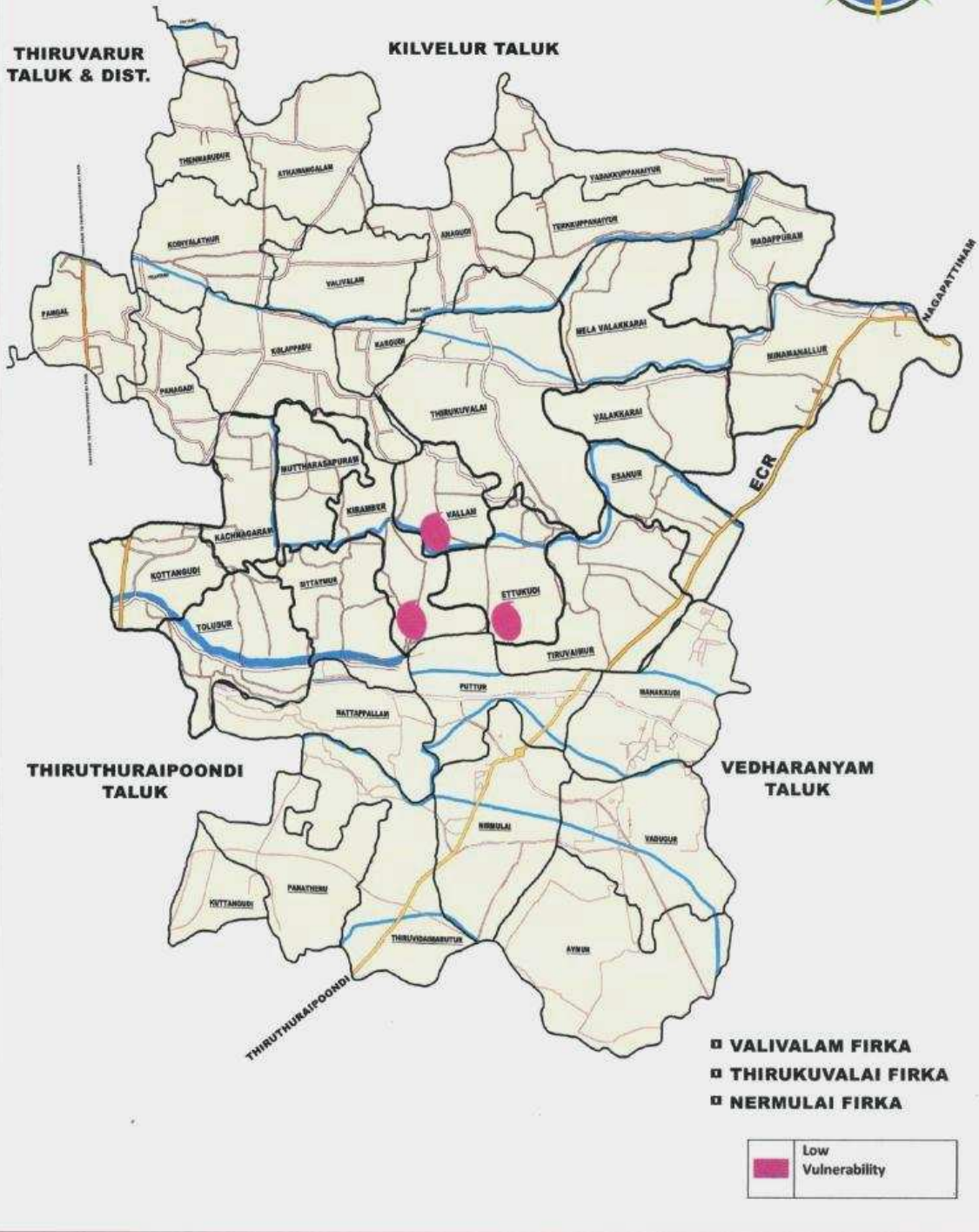
NAGAPATTINAM DISTRICT KIZHVELUR TALUK MAP

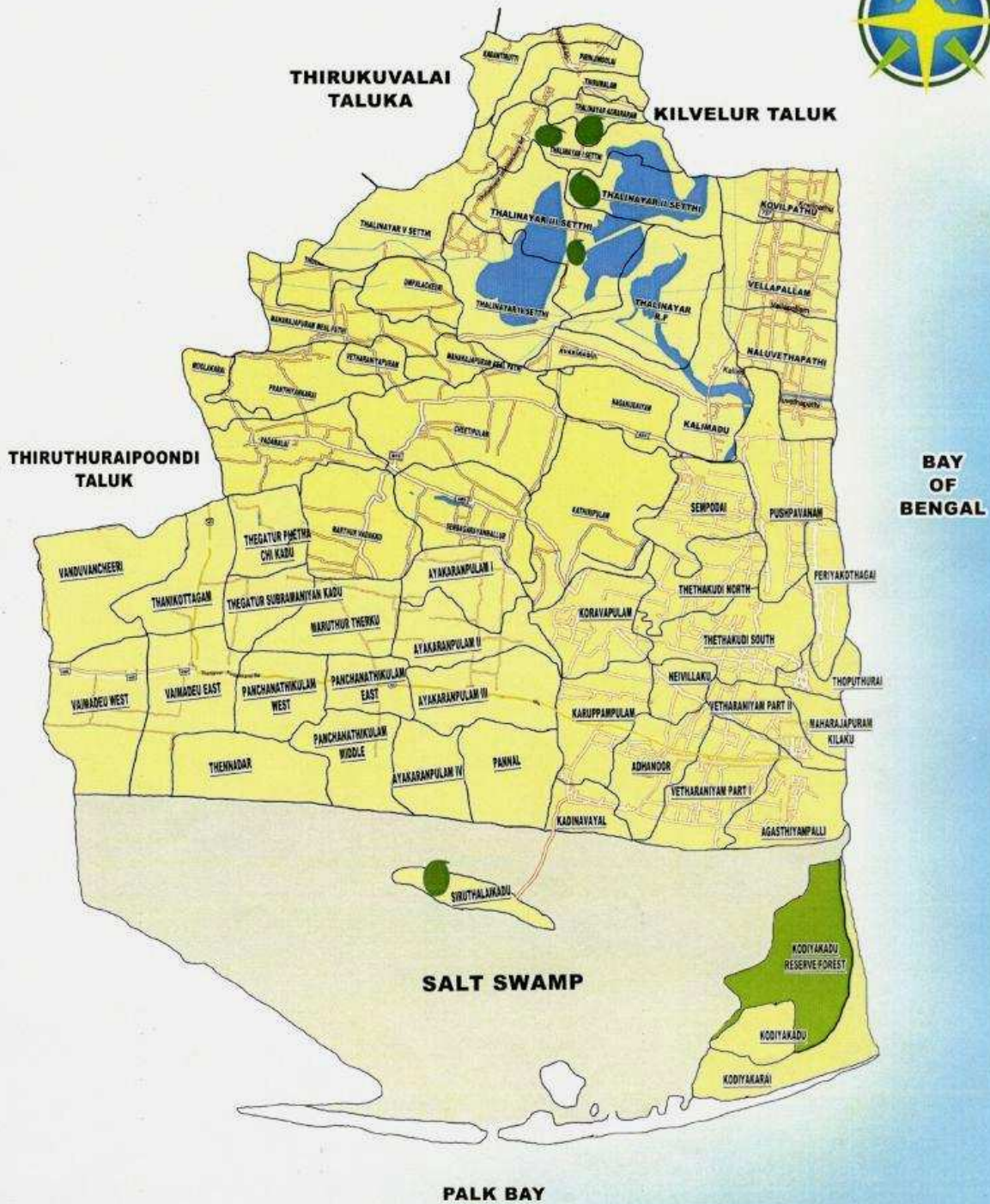
NAGAPPATINAM DISTRICT THIRUKUVALAI TALUK MAP

5. INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISM

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

The District Collector is the District Relief Officer who has the overall charge in all relief operations in the district. He also chairs the District Advisory Committee that includes all departmental heads, divisional heads and other district level officers (Annexure - I). It is the apex body for co-ordination between different departments involved in the relief operations.

DIVISIONAL LEVEL ADMINISTRATION

The Sub Collector/RDO is the Divisional Zonal Officers/Divisional Relief Officer and in-charge of the overall relief operations in the Revenue division.

TALUK LEVEL ADMINISTRATION

Additional Zonal Officers, in the cadre of Deputy Collectors are placed in-charge of each Taluk. They shall be stationed at the Taluk headquarters of their charge to supervise the relief operations in that Taluk.

FIRKA LEVEL ADMINISTRATION

Each firka is placed under the supervision of a Zonal Officer, either a special Tahsildar or a Panchayat Union Commissioner, to assist the Taluk Tahsildar in all anti disaster operations. They shall be stationed in their respective firka headquarters in times of emergency.

MUNICIPAL AND TOWN PANCHAYAT ADMINISTRATION

The Municipal Commissioner and the E.O. (Town Panchayat) are the Relief Officers in the concerned Municipality and town Panchayat areas respectively. These officers are responsible for relief operations in their areas.

6. RISK GOVERNANCE

INSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK

The management of response in disasters requires the Government, community, civil society and other stakeholders to carry out a large number of tasks. The activities involved in response management would depend on the nature and type of disaster.

It is pertinent to refer to the definitions of “Disaster”, “Disaster Management” and “Types of Disasters” to understand what constitutes a disaster and prescribe an appropriate “Incident Response System”

The UNISDR (2009) defines disaster as “A serious disruption of the functioning of a community or a society involving widespread human, material, economic or environmental losses and impacts, which exceeds the ability of the affected community or society to cope using its own resources.”

UNISDR considers disaster to be a result of the combination of many factors such as the exposure to hazards, the conditions of vulnerability that are present, and insufficient capacity or measures to reduce or cope with the potential negative consequences. Disaster impacts may include loss of life, injuries, disease and other negative effects on human physical, mental and social well-being, together with damage to property, destruction of assets, loss of services, social and economic disruption and environmental degradation.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

The Disaster Management Act 2005 uses the following definition for disaster: “Disaster” means a catastrophe, mishap, calamity or grave occurrence in any area, arising from natural or manmade causes, or by accident or negligence which results in substantial loss of life or human suffering or damage to and destruction of property or damage to, or degradation of environment and is of such a nature or magnitude as to be beyond the coping capacity of the community of the affected area.”

DISTRICT DISASTER MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

The District Disaster Management Authority has been constituted under the Chairmanship of District Collector in all the Districts. The District Disaster Management Authority acts as the District planning coordinating and implementing body for disaster

management and takes all measures in accordance with the guidelines laid down by the State Disaster Management Authority. The Members of District Disaster Management Authority are:

- District Collector – Chairperson
- District Revenue Officer – CEO of DDMA
- Superintendent of Police (SP)
- Personal Assistant (General) to Collector
- Additional Collector Development
- Joint Director (Health)

DISTRICT EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTRE (DEOC)

The District Emergency Operation Centre (DEOC) functions under the direct supervision of the District Collector. The DEOC acts as a communication centre at the district level for dissemination of information received from State Emergency Operation Centre to Taluk and Village level. During disaster period, the centre functions round the clock by drafting the services of the Line Departments in the district for quick dissemination of alerts and collects information on the search, rescue, relief and rehabilitation operations from various quarters and updates the same to Commissioner of Revenue Administration & State Relief Commissioner. This centre is accessed by the public by calling toll free No. 1077. Separate control rooms are established at the office of Revenue Divisional Officers and Taluk Offices. Based on necessity, additional control rooms are established temporarily in the scene of occurrence.

TALUK/BLOCK/ZONE LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

A Disaster can be effectively handled only to the extent that adequate delegation has taken place and involvement of all wings of Government are clear about their respective roles. A Taluk/ Block level disaster management committee is necessary and shall be formed under the direction of the District Collector. This Committee will monitor the development and implementation of taluk level disaster management plans.

INTER DEPARTMENTAL ZONAL TEAMS FOR GROUP OF VULNERABLE AREAS

Inter departmental Zonal Teams are formed under the leadership of Revenue Authority. The team members are drawn from Police, Fire services, Rural Development, Forest, Agriculture Departments etc. Each team will closely monitor 5 to 7 vulnerable areas.

VILLAGE/WARD LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The coastal districts bear the brunt of the monsoon and hence to have a better community involvement in disaster management, Village/Ward level Committees are formed. This Committee of First Responders is perhaps the most important to be formed and the District Collector directly takes care to put in place a balanced committee with good representation. Every disaster requires total involvement and wholehearted cooperation of the village/ward level citizens. The Panchayat, VAO, local institutions, NGOs, youth clubs and the like will be encouraged by the administration to be involved in the event of an emergency. The first responders are trained to make the communities strong and vibrant in pro- actively tackling the disasters. Community participation at grass root level is enabled through enrolment of able bodied volunteers, with skills of swimming and climbing, as first responders (10 per vulnerable area). First responder teams are formed in Areas of very high and high vulnerability. The first responders are trained by Fire services / SDRF and Red Cross society. Mobile teams of First Responders and Snake Catchers at Block / Taluk / Sub-Divisional and District levels are formed for deployment based on need.

The First Responders play a key role in providing (first aid, search and rescue, extrication from damaged buildings, road clearance, fire fighting) raising awareness (about hazards, risks and disaster response) community drills (annual drills for disaster response in the community) equipping the community with minimum resources (first aid kit, extrication equipment, lifejackets, lifebuoys, rope etc.)

The various departments of Government and the local bodies associated with the disaster management functions are presented below:

FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Fire and Rescue Services Department of the Government of Tamil Nadu is entrusted with the task of fire fighting and rescue operations in times of emergency. The Fire and Rescue Services Directorate plays a very vital role in the area of fire fighting and fire prevention. Apart from fire fighting, this department also undertakes rescue activities and helps people marooned in floods and caught in the debris of fallen buildings, road and rail accidents and other natural and man-made disasters.

THE STATE DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (TNDRF)

State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) has been constituted with a strength of 80 Police, 3 Inspectors of Police, 6 Sub-Inspectors of Police and 70 Police Personnel from other ranks. They have been trained in disaster management and rescue operations in consultation with National Disaster Response Force (NDRF). In order to strengthen the disaster response force, police personnel from Special Forces were trained in rescue and evacuation operations with the help of NDRF and SDRF. Totally 2500 police personnel at the rate of 70 in each coastal district were trained. The SDRF is trained on the lines of the NDRF to deal with any untoward situation. They are trained in disaster response techniques such as detection and location; Extrication and access; Fire Fighting; Medical and First Aid. The first responders in the district were in turn trained by trainers of Fire services / SDRF and Red Cross society.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has issued orders to establish the Tamil Nadu Disaster Response Force (TNDRF) on the lines of NDRF to respond to both Natural and

Manmade Disasters.

HOME GUARDS / CIVIL DEFENSE

The Tamil Nadu Home Guards organization came into being in 1963 as per Tamil Nadu Home Guards Rules, 1963, as a voluntary citizens' force to assist the Police in the maintenance of Law and Order and for meeting emergencies like floods, fires, cyclones, etc. The Home Guards organization renders valuable assistance in the regulation of traffic, crowd control, maintenance of internal security, promotion of communal harmony, the spread of awareness on health, hygiene, drug abuse, AIDS and road safety, etc.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT CONTACT DIRECTORY

An Emergency Management Contact Directory containing contact numbers of all nodal officials in disaster management at the national, State and District level of the Government, private, NGOs and the community are being prepared and maintained. The Collector supervises and coordinates the preparation and regular updating of this directory at the district website. The DDMA develops a comprehensive resource inventory of NGO's, CBO's and organizations in disaster management and emergency response. Networking enables quick access to resources to minimize response time in emergencies. The system gives the location of specific equipment and resources as well as the controlling authority for that resource so that it can be mobilized for response in the shortest possible time. The database will be made available at the district and State levels and can be used for all emergencies. Similarly, an expert database comprising of trained experts in various disasters, volunteers, NGOs, retired Government servants, swimmers, rescuers etc. will be prepared by each district and sent to the TNSDMA. An updated list of professionals like doctors, paramedical, civil and construction engineers, architects and town planners will also be maintained and send it to the TNSDMA every year for updating of the State list.

7. PREPAREDNESS – CYCLONES AND FLOODS

ACTION POINTS – CYCLONES

ACTION AFTER THE FIRST WARNING

It should be ensured that:-

- a. sufficient stock of food grains, kerosene and other dry food commodities are available for Distribution to the victims.
- b. Medical and Veterinary Departments are fully equipped with required Drugs and Vaccines for taking preventive steps after cyclone and to arrest the spread of epidemics.
- c. all the Government vehicles are kept in road-worthy condition for putting them to use in the emergency.
- d. a list of generators available is maintained by TNEB and advance action taken immediately to procure them when necessity arises.
- e. That action is taken for opening of cyclone stores for providing the following materials.
 - ✓ Hooks of the type available with the Fire Service Department for cleaning debris.
 - ✓ Rubber tyres and tubes for using as floats, catamarans, boats.
 - ✓ Tents
 - ✓ Kerosene lanterns.
 - ✓ Large cooking vessels for use in relief camps.
 - ✓ Identity slips to be issued to be victims in relief camps.
 - ✓ Copies of maps, etc.
 - ✓ Ropes, wires, chains, lights, with wire fittings, lead wires, torches, etc.
 - ✓ Spare Road Market Stores, Steel poles, Bamboos, G.C. Sheets, and Slotted Stripes of metal (to be laid on churned up road surface for better transportation).
 - ✓ Double handle saws (for cutting fallen trees), Shovels, Candles, Land Hailers, Hose pipes, first aid kits, cyclone duty sign Boards, Rods, Asbestos, Sheets, Torch lights, Jerry cans, empty oil drums, gunny bags and sand bags, buckets, V.H.F. sets with batteries for use.
 - ✓ Fodders, pumps for bailing out water along with hose spades, crow bars,
 - hard gloves, Eucalyptus oil, naphthalene balls, bamboo mats, phenyl
 - slate line, etc., Which are useful for burying carcasses and dead bodies.

ACTION AFTER RECEIPT OF WARNING OF ACTUAL THREAT

Evacuation
Relief to Stranded persons.
Stoppage of traffic on State and National Highways
Stock of food grains and other essential items
Declaration of local holiday to the Educational institutions

POST-CYCLONE MEASURES

- ✓ Rescue Operations.
- ✓ Convening of the meetings of the Committees
- ✓ Removal of dead bodies and carcasses.
- ✓ Health Measures.
- ✓ Restoration of traffic.
 - i. Adequate number of mobile squads shall also made available for helping clearing the fallen trees, etc.
 - ii. Electricity Board should clear the roads of fallen electric poles and restore power supply as quickly as possible.
 - iii. The Public Relations Department must ensure to build up photographic record of the damage simultaneously, using services of the local Officers or by employing local man.
 - iv. Immediately after the cyclone, the Divisional Revenue officers should form required number of teams to assess damage to the houses, crops, loss of human lives, livestock etc.

Arrangement for keeping telephone and telegraph lines in order;
- x. Storage of food in interior, vulnerable strategic and key areas;
- xi. Arrangements of dry food stuff and other necessities and of life;
- xii. Arrangements for keeping the drainage system desilted and properly maintained.
- xiii. Agricultural measures;
- xiv. Health and Veterinary measures;
- xv. Selection of flood shelters;
- xvi. Advance arrangements for army assistance;
- xvii. Training in flood relief work;
- xviii. Organization of relief parties;
- xix. Alternative drinking water supply arrangements;
- xx. Other precautionary measures

ARRANGEMENTS DURING AND AFTER FLOODS

ORGANISING RESCUE OPERATIONS

- Organising shelter for the people in distress, in case the efforts of the civil authorities are considered inadequate, Army assistance should be requisitioned.
- Relief measures by non-official and voluntary organisations may be enlisted as far as possible.
- Organise relief camps. Provision of basic amenities like drinking water, sanitation and public health care and arrangements of cooked food in the relief camps.
- Making necessary arrangements for air dropping of food packets in the marooned villages through helicopters.
- Organising enough relief parties to the rescue of the marooned people within a reasonable time limit.
- Establish alternate communication links to have effective communication with marooned areas.
- Organising controlled kitchens to supply foods initially at least for a week.
- Organising cattle camps, if necessary, and provide veterinary care, fodder and cattle feed to the affected animals.
- Grant of emergency relief to all the affected people and Rehabilitation of homeless.
- Submission of daily reports and dissemination of correct information through mass media to avoid rumors.
- Commencement of agricultural activities –e.g., de-silting, re-sowing.

- Repairs and reconstructions of infrastructural facilities such as roads, embankments, Resettlement of flood prone areas.
- Health and sanitary measures.
- Relief for economic reconstruction.

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES TAKEN BY FISHERIES DEPARTMENT:

- Dissemination of weather warning information to fishermen in time by Phone, VHF Sets, Satellite phone.
- Village level committee formed in all 25 coastal villages.
- First respondent identified in all the coastal villages- 63 No.
- Created whatsapp group among the fishermen leaders, fisher youth Fishermen panchayat and boat owners.
- Arrangement of round clock duty at the district head quarters and Control rooms.



8. PREVENTION & MITIGATION PLAN (2018-2030)

The North east monsoon rains are the most useful one to this district and help the farmers to raise their crops. The average North east monsoon rainfall of this district is 1172 mm and the total rainy days are less than 30 days. The disaster by this NE monsoon may be within ninety days duration alone. Within this ninety days the district have to face too many cyclones which hits the coast and damages occurs only on the crops, irrigation infrastructures, roads, power and huts. To encounter this disaster the Government authorities are taking too many steps which may become useless at times because the nature takes all advantages.

The Cauvery Delta system is an ancient system from time immemorial. The natural rivers and the 'A' class channels taking off from them with their branches and distributaries running to several thousand kilometres, carrying both irrigation deliveries and the drainages that set in from return flows and rainfall run off in the vast Delta is the physical system that we have had on ground for centuries. It is not that easy to change that physical system to perform like a modern system designed to function as in a newly executed reservoir irrigation system. All these decades since we created the Mettur reservoir, we could only attend to the minimum needs of operation and maintenance to conserve water wherever we could and aim at increasing the efficiency in irrigation delivery and could not plan a large overhaul of the entire irrigation network below the Grand Anicut. Such an effort requires a concerted effort and large financial investment, also putting in place a special team of expert professionals and staff to plan to design and execute an effective modernization programme.

The problems and issues in the Delta, which is a naturally evolved system, and where the rivers and their branches form the network, are unique. The land holdings are quite small and more than 75% are one ha or less. The ryot is a class by him, his earnings may not be great but he is deeply wedded to the soil and to his profession, agriculture. He has developed a culture different from the uplanders but not conservative in his practices. Density of population has progressively diminished his land holdings. Labour intensive practices in agriculture are preferred to mechanization since mechanization in small holdings is not economical.

Being engaged in agriculture for most part of the year he does not seek any other avocation and the community is essentially agrarian with a few possessing the land and the others working as agricultural labourers on the land. This is different from the scene in similar irrigated areas in the uplands where the irrigated expanse will not be this large but confined to a defined command and the people would be engaged in diversified avocations. Change if and when it comes through Modernisation has to be necessarily planned for these systems not

only in a big way, but also comprehensively, to achieve the maximum benefit per unit of water and land. Dealing with existing situation, the problem faced and the improvements envisaged through modernization.

7.1 FLOOD

River flooding is a regular hazard faced by the District. All the major river systems in the District are vulnerable to flooding, as captured in the Vulnerability Atlas.

Suggested preventive measures:

- Not permitting unrestricted new development in the hazard prone areas
- Anchoring and flood proofing structures to be built in known flood prone areas
- Built-in safe guards for new water and sewage systems and utility lines from flooding
- Enforcing risk zone, base flood elevation, and flood way requirements
- Prohibition on development in wet lands
- Prescribing standards for different flood zones on flood maps.

To meet these requirements, local governments will have to adopt specific flood plan Management into zoning and subdivision regulations, housing and building codes, and resource protection regulations. In low-lying areas, close to the coast, and on flat land in river valleys, there may be a potential for coastal or river flooding. In geologically younger river valleys, there may be a potential for flash-flooding.

It is important to check the history of flooding in the area. Wherever possible

- Map the extent of land covered by past floodwaters
- Get an indication of the depth of past floodwaters
- Find out the severity of past floods; how much damage they have caused, how fast they flowed and how much debris they left behind and
- Find out how often flooding has happened, over at least the past 20years

7.2 BACK WATER IN RIVERS THROUGH ESTUARY

The problems of soil salinity are most widespread particularly in the coastal regions where the ingress of sea water through estuaries and rivers and through groundwater causes large-scale salinization. Soil salinity is also a serious problem in areas where groundwater of high salt content is used for irrigation. Accumulation of excess salts in the root zone resulting in a partial or complete loss of soil productivity is a worldwide phenomenon. The most serious salinity problems are being faced in the irrigated arid and semi-arid regions of the world and it is in these very regions that irrigation is essential to increase agricultural production to satisfy food requirements.

Principles of water management may result in wastage of water through seepage; over-watering. However, irrigation is often costly, technically complex and requires skilled management. Failure to apply efficient and inadequate drainage result in water logging and salinity problems which reduce the soil productivity, eventually leading to loss of cultivable land. The problem of soil degradation is a serious threat to the welfare of mankind. Although degradation of the land has always characterized man's systematic use of it, the process has accelerated in recent decades and precisely at a time when population growth and rising expectations have begun to demand enormous increases in food production.

The amount of crop yield reduction depends on such factors as crop growth, the salt content of the soil, climatic conditions, etc. In extreme cases where the concentration of salts in the root zone is very high, crop growth may be entirely prevented.

Suggested preventive methods:

To improve crop growth in such soils the excess salts must be removed from the root zone. The term reclamation of saline soils refers to the methods used to remove soluble salts from the root zone. This is by far the most effective procedure for removing salts from the root zone of soils.

Leaching is most often accomplished by ponding fresh water on the soil surface and allowing it to infiltrate. Leaching is effective when the salty drainage water is discharged through subsurface drains that carry the leached salts out of the area under reclamation. Leaching may reduce salinity levels in the absence of artificial drains when there is sufficient natural drainage, i.e. the ponded water drains without raising the water table.

Leaching should preferably be done when the soil moisture content is low and the groundwater table is deep. Leaching during the summer months is, as a rule, less effective because large quantities of water are lost by evaporation. The actual choice will however depend on the availability of water and other considerations. In some parts of India for example, leaching is best accomplished during the summer months because this is the time when the water table is deepest and the soil is dry. This is also the only time when large quantities of fresh water can be diverted for reclamation purposes.

It is important to have a reliable estimate of the quantity of water required to accomplish salt leaching. The initial salt content of the soil, desired level of soil salinity after leaching, depth to which reclamation is desired and soil characteristics are major factors that determine the amount of water needed for reclamation.

A useful rule of thumb is that a unit depth of water will remove nearly 80 percent of salts from a unit soil depth. Thus 30 cm water passing through the soil will remove approximately 80 percent of the salts present in the upper 30 cm of soil. Similarly, to reduce the salt content of the surface 60 cm of soil to about 20 percent of the original value would require the passage of about 60 cm of water through the soil. Modifying water management through appropriate irrigation practices can often lead to increased crop yields under saline soil conditions.

Most plants require a continuous supply of readily available moisture to grow normally and produce high yields. After an irrigation the soil moisture content is maximum and the salt concentration or the osmotic pressure of the soil solution is minimal favorable for crop growth. As the soil progressively dries out due to evapo-transpiration losses the concentration of salts in the soil solution and therefore, its osmotic pressure increases making the soil water increasingly difficult to be absorbed by the plants.

Thus infrequent irrigation aggravates salinity effects on growth. On the other hand, more frequent irrigations, by keeping the soil at a higher soil moisture content prevent the concentration of salts in the soil solution and tend to minimize the adverse effects of salts in the soil. For these reasons crops grown in saline soils must be irrigated more frequently compared to crops grown under non-saline conditions so that the plants are not subjected to excessively high soil moisture stresses due to combined influence of excess salts and low soil water contents.

Irrigation farming calls for particular skills in the application of water and the tillage of irrigated soil if its great potential for increased productivity is to be developed and sustained. The efficiency of irrigation schemes rests, in the final analysis, on the individual cultivator who is the most important link in the chain of production. When irrigation is introduced in a new area the farmers of the region have had little or no experience in handling large quantities of water on the farm.

Since the cultivator may be tradition bound and lack the benefit of education, effort and ingenuity must be applied to convert him into an efficient irrigator. To ensure steady progress in irrigation methods and water use efficiency the farmer must be kept informed of new ideas through organization of appropriate training and other extension programmes. Well designed and operated irrigation and drainage systems can increase the productivity of irrigated agriculture but only if they are effective right down to the farmer's field.

The individual farmer must understand the importance of land shaping and uniform water application, the need and desirability of irrigating crops based on available scientific

information, the importance and best ways of maintenance of field, channels including proper lining procedures, best methods for control of weeds in irrigation and drainage channels, etc. A continuous effort to elevate the level of education of the cultivator will result in enhanced capability to manage the land and water resources with minimum degradation through salinization and related phenomena.

7.3 COASTAL EROSION

Coastal areas are one of the key systems for global sustainability. These are the transition areas between land and sea. Coastal regions gained importance because of multiple uses, like high productivity of the ecosystem, highly concentrated population, industrial friendly, waste disposal, tourism, transportation, strategic planning in military and many more. These coasts are always in a dynamic state trying to change, and nature always works for maintaining the equilibrium. India, with most diverse ecosystem, high productivity and thickly populated over coastal region, has gained its very own importance. Despite all of these, Indian coasts are under threat due to multiple stresses like global climate change and human intervention. These stresses are driving vulnerabilities like sea-level rise, coastal erosion, frequent extreme events, and saltwater encroachment. In this critical scenario, coastal management has become one of the very important issues in the last two decades.

Nagapattinam district is a coastal district having a coast length of 188 Km length. Coastal District of Tamil Nadu, on the eastern coast, Bay of Bengal is vulnerable to extreme events like Cyclone, Tsunami and a low lying one. During these extreme events many stretches of the coast has undergone erosion which are categorized as under:

1. Wind Erosion
2. Rain Erosion
3. Soil Erosion

WIND EROSION are caused due to exposed slope of non-Cohesive loose and dry soil, Lack of Shelter from wind and exposed surface without any protection.

RAIN EROSION is a erosion of loose super facial matters by the direct impact of falling rain drops. The intensity of the splash erosion depends on the kinetic energy falling rain drops. It becomes more effective on vegetation free slopes while falling rain drop directly hit surface with full kinetic energy.

SOIL EROSION threatens food productions. Human beings obtain more than 99.7% of their food (Calories) from the land and less than 0.3% from the Oceans. Soil is being lost from agriculture areas, 10 to 40 times faster than the soil formations. Vettiver grass is the

cheapest and easily handled by the farmers. Vettiver grass is very simple, practical, inexpensive, low maintenance and very effective means of soil conservations.

Suggested preventive methods:

Erosion Control Systems

1. Traditional / Conventional methods
2. Agronomic Methods
3. Non Agronomic Methods
4. Reinforced vegetation
5. Coir Geo textiles

Agronomic methods

Simple vegetation and native grasses such as Vettiver is relatively inexpensive and effective method. Since it binds the soil with roots, minimizes rain drop splash reduces soil erosion and increases runoff retention time and therefore, promotes infiltration.

Mulching prevents erosive process and sediment losses and it protects soil and sub-soil structure.

Non-agronomic methods

❑ TABLE DRAINS

The table drains are excavated open channels that run adjacent to the road formation and are used to collect water runoff from the road surface.

❑ DISH DRAINS

Dish drains are shallow depressions used to collect and direct water to a stable discharge points. They provide an alternative to rollovers and or generally placed Where, there is a natural depression in road, where low water velocities encountered.

❑ CROSS DRAINS

Cross drains (relief pipes) are used to transfer water flow in a table drain located on the high side of the road, by piping the water under the road to the low side for controlled discharge.

❑ CATCH DRAINS

Catch drain is a constructed depression above a cut or fills batter to prevent batter erosion and direct runoff to stable discharge points.

Reinforced vegetation

By using geo textiles and other materials to improve slope stability. Synthetic jute and coir used as geo textiles. Disadvantages is it causes air and water pollutions while their non bio-degradability is responsible for increasing soil pollutions.

Coir geo textiles

Made from coconut fibre extracted from the husk of the coconut fruit. It is a bio-degradable organic fibre containing cellulose and lignin. It gives maximum protection to the soil.

7.4 TSUNAMI

Tsunamis are ocean waves produced by earthquakes or underwater landslides. Tsunamis are often incorrectly referred to as tidal waves, but a tsunami is actually a series of waves that can travel at speeds averaging 450 (and up to 600) miles per hour in the open ocean. However, waves that are 10 to 20 feet high can be very destructive and cause many deaths or injuries.

Tsunamis are most often generated by earthquake-induced movement of the ocean floor. Landslides, volcanic eruptions, and even meteorites can also generate a tsunami. Areas at greatest risk are less than 25 feet above sea level and within one mile of the shoreline. So far as Nagapattinam District is concern there are 6 costal Taluks and as per Analysis of Mean Sea level of Nagapattinam District there are 75 villages of 6 costal Taluk are less than 1 km far

from sea and on less than 10 meter of height from ocean level. Most deaths caused by a tsunami are because of drowning. Associated risks include flooding, contamination of drinking water, fires from ruptured tanks or gas lines, and the loss of vital community infrastructure.

7.5 SOIL EROSION

Soil erosion is a common phenomenon and that too for a delta district like Nagapattinam is highly prone.

Suggested preventive methods:

- **Crop Rotation**

Crop rotation can significantly reduce the amount of soil lost by water.

- **Cover crops**

Cover crop is a crop planted primarily to manage soil erosion, soil quality, soil fertility, Bio diversity and wildlife in an agro eco system.

- **Contour bounding**

It is the forming practice of plugging or planting across the slope following its elevation contour lines. These lines create a water break which reduces the formation of rills and gullies during times of heavy water runoff which is major cause of soil erosion.

9. RESPONSE PLAN INCLUDING INCIDENT RESPONSE SYSTEM (COVERING RESCUE, EVACUATION AND RELIEF)

REVENUE DEPARTMENT

DISTRICT COLLECTOR

The District Collector is also the District Relief Officer responsible for all relief operations in the district Overall supervision over relief operations

SUB-COLLECTOR / REVENUE DIVISIONAL OFFICERS

- The Revenue Divisional Officer/Divisional Relief Officer and Divisional Zonal Officer is the member of the District Advisory Committee.
- Overall in-charge of relief operations in the division.
- Maintains Flood Control Room at the Divisional Headquarters and supervises the publicity of flood warning.
- Supervises the evacuation of victims and other relief operations and the rehabilitation of evacuees.
- Decide on the period of stay of evacuees in shelter homes.
- Evacuation and Housing Plan Report to the Collector.
- Depute staff for the enumeration of the dead (people and cattle), damages to houses, crops, etc.. in form 20A.
- Daily Situation Report to the collector.

TAHSILDARS

- List out shelter homes – Cyclone shelters, schools, public buildings, Kalyana mandapams, Low laying areas details etc.,
- To inspect and oversee repair all shelter homes by 1st October.
- Assess the capacity of shelter homes in vulnerable villages and report to Divisional Officer/Collector in case of any shortage
- Store relief materials in and around highly vulnerable villages by 15th October
- Assess the availability of catamarans and boats and form teams of villagers who could assist in evacuation
- List out all NGOs who could help in relief work.
- List availability of generator sets for emergency use in hospitals, etc.,
- List availability of diesel pump-sets

- Review the capacity of bakeries, restaurants, caterers, etc. who could supply bread /food packets on short notice
- Monitor irrigation sources in liaison with PWD officials
- Supervises relief operations and report the same to Collector/SC/RDO
- Decides on the location and type of kitchen to cater to shelter home
- Undertakes distribution of relief materials
- Sends daily rainfall data at 8.30 A.M and daily damage report to the collector/SC/RDO
- Rehabilitation - Assessment of damage – to be reported in prescribed format and Maintains Law and order

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS

- Patrols irrigation sources for any possible breach
- Disseminates warning information to the public by beat of tom-tom, etc...
- Sends report of any incident/calamity to Tahsildar and local police station by special messengers as well as by telephone
- Provides food to shelter homes using the services of noon meal cooks, if available
- Ensure availability of cooking vessels
- Watch law and order situation and report to higher authorities

VILLAGE ASSISTANTS

- Patrol irrigation sources for any possible breach
- Disseminate calamity related information to the public by beat of tom-tom , etc...
- Send report of any incident/calamity to the VAO, Tahsildar and local police station by special messengers as well as by telephone, if available

HINDU RELIGIOUS AND CHARITABLE ENDOWMENT DEPARTMENT

ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER (HR&CE)

Arrange to make temple buildings available for shelter homes

FOREST DEPARTMENT

- Arrange to supply casuarina poles to PWD and Highways Dept., when required
- Arrange to provide firewood for feeding centres, as and when required

REGIONAL TRANSPORT OFFICER

- Enlist available lorries, trucks, vans and buses for use during rescue operations
- Assist PWD in moving sandbags using tractors, etc
- Earmark sufficient number of vehicles to transport sand bags etc., to the affected areas
- Keep the list of private vehicles for requisitioning in times of need.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. Keep law and order and regulate traffic during the time of natural calamities
2. Formation of rescue *teams*
3. Co-ordinate with other Departments in evacuation operations
4. Ensure the functioning of all wireless sets and vehicles
5. Extend round the clock VHF service at the Collectorate with men for its operation
6. Rescue Boats with the Armed Reserve to be pressed into rescue and relief operations
7. Render help in regulating the *food distribution* to the Victims.
8. Recover, transport under proper escort, protect, maintain proper account of and restore property to the rightful persons of properties and valuables from flood-affected areas.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

- Executive Engineer (Irrigation)
- Watch Cauvery and Vennar and other river systems s, dams, anicuts, major tanks etc.
- Daily report on damages to major irrigation sources
- Daily Report on Mettur Dam position and daily inflow/outflow figures
- Ensure functioning of VHF sets, vehicles, etc..
- Patrolling of irrigation sources
- Store adequate sandbags and ensure availability of extra sandbags at short notice
- Identify vulnerable zones by 15th September and ensure repairs by 15 October
- Ensure availability of petromax, hurricane lights, etc.
- Assistant Engineer to send *weekly progress report* from August every year to his immediate superior and to the Collector regarding the No. of tanks in his charge.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT (C&M) DIVISION

- Maintain road communication –
- Quickly remove any obstruction due to cyclone and floods and repair road breaches immediately and restore transport facilities with least delay
- Daily *road damage report* to the Collector
- List of men and Material and their location for emergency
- Co-ordinate with Fire Services Dept for power-saws for cutting fallen trees
- Stock bamboo, gunny bags, casuarina poles, road metal, drums, etc..
- Identify weak stretches by 15th September and repair by 1st October
- Ensure availability of saws, axes, petromax, hurricane lights, etc...
- Patrol all bridges, roads, etc.,

TAMIL NADU ELECTRICITY BOARD (TNEB)

- List out availability of Generators for emergency use
- Keep sufficient stock of rubber gloves, safety tools, lights and petromax
- Assess all rusted and weak poles well in advance and replace by 10th October
- The Supervisory field staffs to be on alert, repair any disruption immediately, ensures that there are no uncapped wires and resume power supply.
- Ensure that no streetlights are switched on where there are fallen uncapped wires.
- Availability of cement posts for restoration.

FISHERIES DEPARTMENT

- Issue warning to and evacuate fishermen
- Instruct fishermen to carry transistors to sea to listen to AIR warnings
- Instructed fishermen to take red cloths or red flags to signal distress
- Ensure the proper maintenance of boats, catamarans, etc. The nets/Boats should be taken away from the affected areas and kept in safer places
- keep ready a good number of private boats/catamarans with crew and good swimmers, equipped with nylon ropes etc

CO-OPTEX

Ensure sufficient stock of dhotis / sarees at local depots

AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT

- Accurate assessment of crop damages.
- Plan advance storage and movement of seeds, pesticides and fertilizers.
- Daily crop damages report to the Collector.

AGRICULTURAL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

- Keep bulldozers, Tractors and pump sets ready in case of sand slides
- Co-operate with other departments in closures of breaches and pumping out of water.
- Assessment of sand loss due to breaches and testing of soil, etc.

CRPF

To help in emergency operations with men and material when needed.

NAVAL DETACHMENTS

1. To act as liaison nodes with the Naval Command
2. To help in times of emergency with men and material available
3. To help disseminate cyclone warnings to the fishermen

FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT

1. Provide power-saws, life buoys, etc..
2. Evacuation of marooned people to safer places with the help of boats/catamarans etc.,
3. Engage swimmers, rowers, etc., for rescue and relief operations

- On any requisition, the Control Room Petty Officer will alert the stand-by duty personnel, inform the commanding officer NCC and act on his orders.
- Equipment available with the unit for flood relief.

TAMILNADU WATER AND DRAINAGE (TWAD) BOARD

- Provide adequate and continuous drinking water.
- Immediate restoration of drinking water if supply disrupted.
- Erect bore-wells and make pump-sets available to pump drinking water.

STATE TRANSPORT CORPORATION

- To provide transportation in evacuation, rescue and other relief operations
- Fuelling and refueling stations to be stocked with adequate fuel.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

- Arrange to hand over School buildings for use as shelters
- Arrange to keep spare keys with concerned VAOs in the villages
- Hand over Noon Meal Centres under the control of schools with the cooking vessels for use in Feeding Centres.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

MEDICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

- The Joint Director of Health Services Nagapattinam to provide casualty services
- Employment of Mobile-surgical units.
- Employment of Mobile First Aid Team
- Stock medicine, vaccines, surgical cotton etc. in the Government Hospitals.
- Work out a system of distribution of Health Services and supplies

- Liaise with the Tahsildar whenever Generators are medical required
- All Primary Health Centres to render first aid service and refer cases to the nearest Taluk Hospital if necessary.
- All the Taluk Headquarter Hospitals are base hospitals and first aid posts for the Taluk.
- The Medical Officers in charge of Blood Banks to keep adequate stock of blood.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY DEPARTMENT

JOINT DIRECTOR

- Keeping Veterinary Dispensaries equipped with necessary medicines
- Vaccination and submission of completion report to the Collector by 15th October
- Formation of Mobile Veterinary Units
- Stock adequate cattle feed and straw for the vulnerable areas – Report by 15 October
- Provide clean drinking water for the cattle population of cyclone affected areas
- Conduct immediate cattle death Census
- Speedy and proper disposal of carcasses
- Teach livestock owners the precautionary first aid methods.
- Post cyclone, de-worming of the entire sheep and goat population in the cyclone area.
- Chlorinate all the ponds and lakes where livestock take water.

CIVIL SUPPLIES

DISTRICT SUPPLY OFFICER

- Regulation of petrol/diesel bunks
- Ensure two months' advance stock at Taluk godowns by 15th October
- Ensure that FPS are opened on all days including Sundays during emergency
- Additional 15 days' stock of all essential commodities in all the Godowns and shops in the Coastal and vulnerable areas.
- The stock of kerosene allotted to the District to be retained till the monsoon is over.

SENIOR REGIONAL MANAGER, TNCSC, NAGAPATTINAM

- Move all the essential commodities and store Minimum of one month's stock of all the essential commodities in all the T.N.C.S.C. Godowns and Fair Price shops.



JOINT REGISTRAR OF CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES, NAGAPATTINAM

- Ensure adequate essential commodities of Rice, Sugar, Kerosene, and Wheat to all the FPS run by the Co-operative Societies.
- Ensure movement of one month's minimum stock at all the shops in Vulnerable areas already identified.

PROJECT DIRECTOR (DEVELOPMENT)

- Overall co-ordination for *emergency works* such as fixing up breaches, etc..
- Post APO, ERE, AE², as Additional Zonal Officer at each Panchayat Union
- Tie up with NGOs in co-ordination with PO (Mahalir Thittam)

PA TO COLLECTOR (NOON MEAL)

- Instruct noon meal Organisers to help in feeding the victims of emergency

PROJECT OFFICER (MAHALIR THITTAM)

- Post APOs as Additional Zonal Officer at Panchayat Unions
- Tie up with NGOs for co-ordination with PO(DRDA)

MUNICIPALITIES AND TOWN PANCHAYATS

- Cleaning of OHTs
- Chlorination of water tanks and ensuring round the clock water supply
- Sanitation staff to be on full alert
- Daily road damage report to the Collector

PANCHAYAT UNION COMMISSIONER

- Instruct all Panchayat Presidents to listen to AIR warnings
- Repair all cyclone shelters
- Provide potable / Drinking water at shelter homes
- Patrol minor irrigation sources for possible breaches
- Send daily MI and road damage reports to the Collector/RDO.

PUBLIC RELATION OFFICER

- Enlist public co-operation in the conduct of all the flood relief operations by seeking the co-operation of the press in emergency.
- Publicity through organised Press Releases of emergency relief measures.

PORT DEPARTMENT – PORT OFFICER

- Disseminate information of adverse weather conditions received to the fishermen immediately.

10. RECOVERY AND RECONSTRUCTION

EARLY WARNING AND RESPONSE

In case of receipt of warning messages of severe cyclone, fishermen are advised by the Assistant Director of fisheries not to venture into the sea for fishing. When the calamity occurs, immediately action is taken to cut off the power supply to avoid loss of lives.

EVACUATION

People in the low-lying areas and coastal areas that are prone to inundation should be evacuated to safer places when danger is sounded. The Divisional Officer should take immediate steps in that direction to evacuate the affected people to the shelter homes already identified by them. A list of school buildings, marriage halls, choultries, cyclone shelters, etc., that can be used as temporary shelters are furnished in the annexure. The number of evacuated families/persons with details of men, women and children should be enumerated and recorded the report sent to the collector daily. The capacity of shelter homes should be assessed well in advance and maximum number of people should be accommodated depending upon their capacity. The availability of equipment's and stores should also be ensured viz.

1.	Catamarans of Boats
2.	Lighting Facility
3.	Drinking Water Facility
4.	Sanitary Arrangements
5.	Cooking Arrangements
6.	Storing of Relief Materials

The revenue authorities should take immediate steps to send the injured and wounded persons to the hospitals and the Primary Health Centres.

DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND OTHER ESSENTIAL ITEMS

Once evacuated (under the orders of Collector or Divisional Level Relief Officer) food packets should be supplied to the evacuees according to the yardstick prescribed by the government.

If there are numerous shelter homes in the taluk, a central kitchen may be set up, preferably at the noon meal centers where kitchen infrastructure are already available, from where food packets could be prepared and supplied to the shelter homes. The VAOs are the custodians of the vessels to be used for cooking. They should assess the availability of the cooking vessels well in advance.

The food should be supplied twice a day following scale of ration as detailed in the Table below:

The special Tahsildar / Taluk Supply Officer should see that the required food articles are drawn from the nearby fair price shops or from the operational godowns of the TNCSC, if necessary. They should also see that adequate quantity of kerosene is stocked for use at the time of emergency. The food packets should be supplied in an orderly manner with the assistance of the police. The firka level relief officers are responsible, for taking the food packets from the central kitchen to the shelter homes. The period of stay of the people in the shelter homes should be decided by the Divisional Zonal Officers in consultation with the Collector.

RESPONSE AND MITIGATION ACTIVITIES

To restore the traffic the wind fallen trees have to be cut and culvert damages to be immediately attended by the Highways department and restored by putting sand bags and erecting casuarina poles. The fallen electrical poles and telecommunication poles have to be

restored within 24 hours by the TNEB and telecom departments by taking steps on war footing manner.

REPORTING

As already discussed above, daily figures on the number of houses, affected number of persons removed to safer places, number missing or dead number of cattle lost the amount of cash relief paid, number of clothing distributed and the quantum of feeding arrangements made and by breaches in river banks noticed and the nature of flood, whether subsiding, rising and whether there is any rice inflow of water into irrigation sources should be reported through wireless or any available means of communication without any delay. Incorrect figures should not be reported.

The Tahsildar should arrange for reporting the rainfall particulars to the flood control room exactly by 8.30 A.M. every day without fail.

DISPOSAL OF CORPSES AND CARCASSES

The following guidelines are issued for observance for the disposal of dead animals.

1. The dead animals should be buried by digging pits in sizes detailed in the Annexure to G.O. 411 RD/PI dated 23.05.86 for away from the habitations.
2. The Carcasses of big animals and small animals should be buried in any one of the sizes of the pits suitable for them.
3. The pit should be initially filled up with limestone to a depth of 6 the and then the dead animals should be buried with filling materials like mud and earth.
4. The sanitary Inspector of the Health Inspector Executive Officer, Town Panchayat or the Extension officer (panchayats) or shall be Municipality responsible to certify that disposal have been properly done. The cost of the operation should not exceed Rs. 20/- (Rupees Twenty) in respect of big animals and RS. 5/- in respect of small animals in respect of Municipality this work should be done by the Health Supervisor Sanitary Inspector order the guidance of Municipal Commissioner.
5. The expenditure should be restricted to the rates fixed and should not exceed the limits.
6. The Executive Officer of Town Panchayat should also adopt the above procedure.
7. The expenditure should initially be met from the general funds of the Panchayat Union Concerned and got reimbursed from the funds allotted by Government for Natural Calamities.

CONCLUSION

The entire planning is aiming at mitigating the suffering of the unfortunate disaster affected people and to help them to overcome the situation as best as possible. The priority is two –fold

- ❑ To safeguard the human lives and to prevent loss of lives as far as possible.
- ❑ To safeguard the properties and to safeguard them to the possible extent.

The officers who implement the enormous task of implementing the contingency plan should realise their responsibility and rise up to the occasion and see that the entire mechanism under them is geared up and work on a war footing manner till the emergency ceases. They may not wait for the orders of superior officers in case of emergency. They should assume responsibility and at the same time they should act prudently. These officers may not be found fault with for any bonafide action done in good faith. However, any slackness or lethargy on the part of any officials on emergency duty will be taken serious note of. They may relax the rules in case of emergency without breaking them. All the departmental officers right from the lowest to the top levels are jointly or solely responsible for the relief operations. The officers concerned should attend to the flood relief operation very swiftly by applying their presence of mind at time of crises and take quick decision to manage and tackle any crisis and this is the essential ingredient for carrying out the relief operations.

It is also stressed that there should work with a sense of urgency and compassion for human lives sense of awareness. In disaster emergency management, the buck stops with the person at the spot. Therefore, the responsibility to mitigate the effects of any disaster rest with the person at the place of disaster at the right time and it is not expected of officials to shirk responsibilities at such times. The District Disaster Management Plan is, inter alia, meant to act as a guide to all those involved in the noble task of disaster management.

RAILWAYS ACCIDENT

Accident in Railways occur due to several causes such as landslides, breaches in Railway track caused by rains, floods, rail wrecking or attempted rail wrecking collisions running over the obstruction places on the rail etc. Though the main responsibility for rendering aid to the victims of a railway accident rest with the railway administration, the local civil authorities have an equitable responsibility to render all possible aid on such occasions with the utmost expedition.

While analyzing past mishap of train accident and considering certain measures for safe guarding the railway tracks against breaches and other defects, the Government of India, felt that the villagers living close to the railway track who notice abnormal occurrence such as heavy floods etc. pass on the information to the nearest railway station in time so that the scheme for enlisting the co-operation of local villagers in communicating timely information of abnormal occurrences likely to affect Vulnerable points and railway track an experimental

measure for a period of two years in the first instance and on the expiry of the experimental period it will be made a permanent measure if found adequate and reasonable.

The flood patrol rules for tanks approved by Government In. G.O. Ms. No.1572, Public Works Department Dt. 31st May 1965 should be followed. The rules for the Cauvery and Coleroon rivers issued in G.O. Ms.No. 214 PWD dt 22 nd June 1976 have to be followed (copies of these rules are available in Appendix VI at page 66 of Ant-Disaster plan Tamilnadu).

When any serious accident occurs intimation of the accident as required in G.O.Ms. No.1572, Public Works Department dated 31st May 1965 should be sent to the S.P. concerned as well as to the State Government. The rules were framed by the Railway Administrating for reporting and investigating accident details and action that has to be taken by the Railway authorities. They are found in Appendix VII at page in the Disaster Plan Tamil Nadu.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY THE DISTRICT AUTHORITIES

As soon as the Collector receives notice of major accidents involving injuries to a number of passengers he should ask the District Medical Officer to instruct the Doctors available in the Government Hospital nearby to rush to the spot with necessary medical equipment.

The railway authorities will invariable in such cases, organize a medical relief train themselves. The particulars of the place and time of departure of such train can be ascertained from the railway officials. Government doctors who are available should be assembled at the station before the time of departure of the medical relief train and should join the party proceeding to the site of the accident.

Private Doctors may be willing to volunteer their services for rendering aid to the victims. The District Medical Association may be approached to take action in this regard. The Collector may also prepare a list of Doctors who practice in the area, services by the various railway stations within two mile of railway track. Voluntary agencies in the area may be informed of the particulars of the accident so that persons belonging to these agencies who are trained in the first aid operation etc., may volunteer their services. The Railway authorities may be approached to give them necessary facilities to reach the accident spot.

RESCUE AND SALVAGE

The accident may be taken advantage of by hooligans and anti-social elements to look for the property found in the wreckage. Measures should be taken to prevent this. Notice of the accident will be given to the officer in-charge of the police station out post within the local

limits of which the accident occurred. He should inform his superiors including the superintendent of police. Police officers should send necessary reinforcement so that the area of the accident might be cordoned off. No one should be allowed within the wreckage except for rendering medical aid. The police should also help in rescuing passengers from the wreckage and in salvaging the properties in the wreckage. As inventory of the property salvaged should also be prepared on the spot.

CLEARANCE OF WRECKAGE

The clearance of the wreckage is the primary responsibility of the Railway whose employees alone will have necessary technical skill and equipment. However, any help rendered by the local authorities in this respect will be welcome.

The work of clearing the wreckage will be carried out expeditiously and will proceed continuously if necessary by work in shifts and with use of flash etc. until it is known definite that every victim has been extricated from the wreckage. If the circumstances are such as to render this impossible the work can be suspended only after making every endeavor to establish beyond all reasonable doubts and with the assistance of medical testimony (preferably independent) that only dead bodies remain.

LAW AND ORDER

Properties both private and Government and also for such other relief measures as the railway administration may not be able to render.

After an inspection of scene of the accident he will submit a preliminary report to the Chief Secretary to Government, and to the Commissioner of Revenue Administration, Chennai-5 explaining the cause of the accident and furnishing particulars relating to human lives lost/etc. and also report the relief measures undertaken. After the relief operations are over he should submit a comprehensive report with full statistics covering all aspects of the accident.

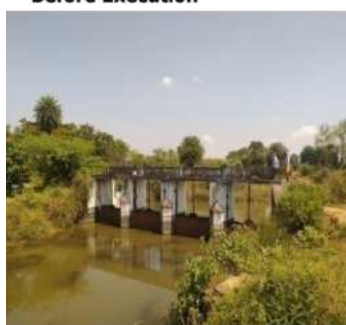

INSTALLATION OF EARLY WARNING SYSTEM (EWS)

The coast of Nagapattinam District is vulnerable to various water and wind based disasters. Early Warning System (EWS) / Disaster Warning Announcement System (DWAS) has been established in 29 locations are which is centrally monitored for fault free functioning, in order to deliver the warning alerts and messages to the targeted coastal community, as and when needed. It has been integrated with the coastal community with the assistance of the Community Based Disaster Risk Management Programme in Nagapattinam District.

This project is being implemented by the TNSDMA, project Management unit and the ELCOT has been appointed as project manager to assist Project Management Unit in implementing the project.

4. MAHATHMA GANDHI NATIONAL RURAL EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE SCHEME(MGNREGA)

MGNREGS Act was passed in the parliament on 2005 and 150 districts throughout the country selected for the implementation of this scheme. Out of them six districts have been selected in Tamilnadu state. Nagapattinam District is one of the pioneering district of Tamilnadu. In Tamil Nadu, the scheme was put into implementation from 2nd Feb 2006 onwards. Being the pioneering district, the district administration had taken strenuous efforts to bring the scheme from paper to field. The district administration did not have enough time to go with IEC activities, as it had to execute the scheme simultaneously.

The Act was converted into a scheme and efforts were taken by the Government to implement the scheme effectively. In this context, the identification of a shelf of projects is the main exercise that would enable to create employment and create durable assets in all Panchayats of Nagapattinam District . This is being done in such a way that there is a visible impact on the major problem of each Panchayat and created a self sustaining economy to address poverty.

Nagapattinam District has 6 Blocks and 193 panchayats and 445 clusters. 1.77Lakhs Families have been registered under MGNREGS. 1.49 Lakh individuals received the job card. In GO the workers has work for 8 hours per day including lunch. The week starts from Thursday and ends next Wednesday. The NMR'S brought from the beneficiaries through worksite Facilitator. After completion of the week, worksite Facilitator will hand over the NMR to DY.BDO (MGNREGS)of concerned Panchayat union. After receiving the NMR Union Overseer has to record the measurement of work turnout. And then the wages have been entered through the (www.nregs.nic.in) e-FMS (Electronic Fund Management System) directly to the Beneficiaries Account.

As per the GO.No.90, Dt:07.05.2024 the wages revised Rs.294 to Rs.319.

For the year 2024-25, the Nagapattinam District has a target of 29.41 lakh projected person-days. The work has been allocated with a Labor and Material ratio of 60:40.

12. COMMUNITY AND OTHER STAKEHOLDER PARTICIPATION

1. COMMUNITY BASED DISASTER RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME (CBDRM)

CBDRM (Community Based Disaster Risk Management) is one of the sub-components of CDRRP (Coastal Disaster Risk Reduction Project) being implemented by Government of Tamilnadu through Revenue Department with Work Bank assistance. SIRD&PR is the Project implementing Agency.

The project is implemented in 561 coastal villages of 12 coastal Districts of Tamilnadu.

Under CBDRM, VDMC (Village Disaster Management Committees) at the Village Panchayat level and five VDMTs (Village Disaster Management Team) in every coastal habitations are formed. Through the members of the VDMC and five VDMTs, the VDRMP (Village Disaster Management Plan) is prepared with the community and the plan is executed during disaster situation. The VDMP plan has also the provisions for mainstreaming the developmental activities.

The members of VDMC and five VDMTs are also trained by professional in Early Warning System, Evacuation, Search and Rescue, Shelter Management and First Aid. With these capacities, the first respondents to the disasters could able to manage the disaster risks.

This programme has been designed to help communities to effectively utilize risk mitigation infrastructure and work together with local Governance system while mobilizing themselves to be better prepared so as to respond to any disaster event. The CBDRM program is being implemented by the Rural Development & Panchayat Raj Department through State Institute of Rural Development at a cost of Rs. 15 Crore.

The major activities to be taken up under this are as follows:

- a. Risk and Vulnerability Assessments,
- b. Community mobilization and capacity building,
- c. Linking communities to DWAS and Evacuation Shelters and
- d. Capacity Strengthening for Emergency response.

OBJECTIVES OF CBDRM

- To reduce vulnerability of communities and strengthen their ability to proactively cope with disasters and natural hazards, through preparation of Villages Disaster Risk Management Plans.

- To form Village Disaster Management Communities and to sensitive all the stakeholders towards the need for disaster management. It also proposes to form various teams and train them in the aspects of early warning, search and rescue, evacuation and first aid in the event of any disaster.
- To make the communities aware about the infrastructure created under CDRRP and to maintain and utilize the same during emergency.

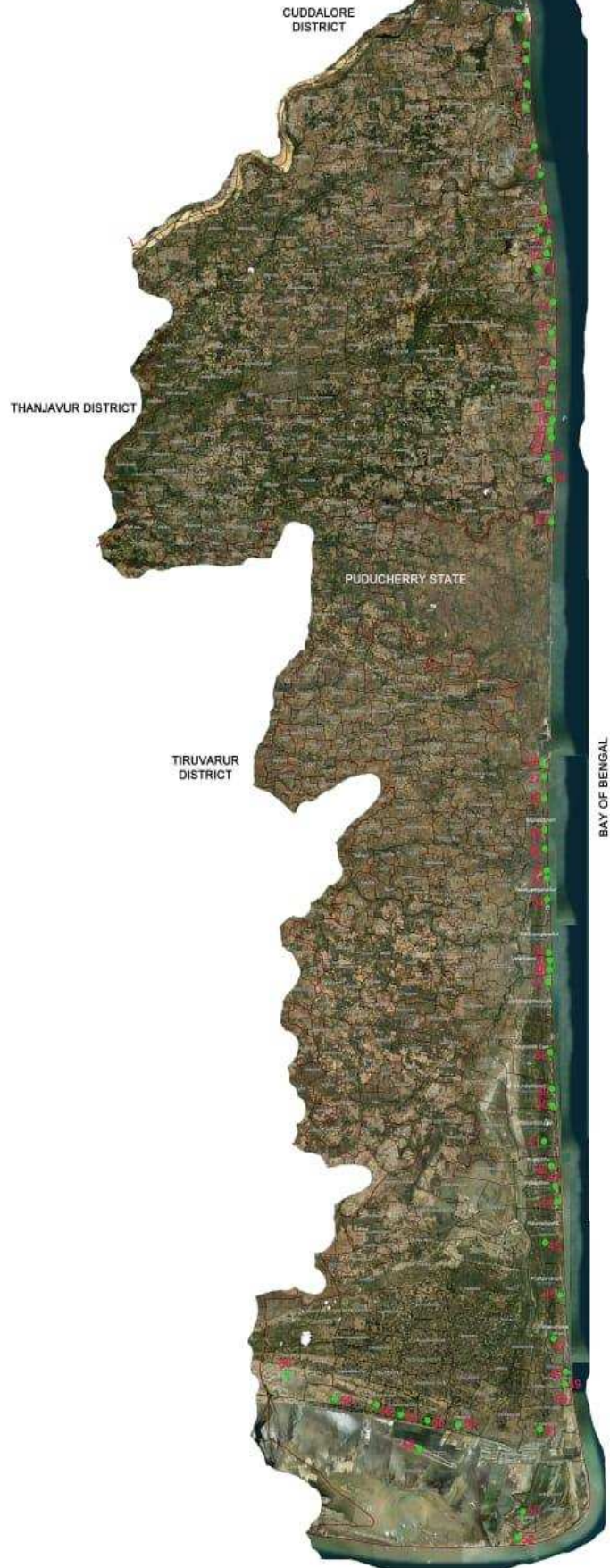

16. DOs AND DON'Ts DURING DISASTER

1. EARTHQUAKE

- ❖ Make your earthquake resistant and secure heavy furniture and objects.
- ❖ Choose a couple of family meeting place; pick easy to identify, open and accessible places that you can easily reach. Prepare to be self-sufficient for a minimum of three days.
- ❖ If inside, stay inside. “DUCK, COVER and HOLD! Duck under firm furniture. Cover as much of your head and upper body as you can. Hold onto the furniture. Move to an inside wall and sit with your back to the wall, bring your knees to your chest and cover your head. Stay away from mirror and window. Do not exit the building during the shaking.
- ❖ If outdoors, move to an open area away from all structures, especially buildings, bridges, and overhead power lines.
- ❖ Move cautiously, and check for unstable objects and other hazards above and around you. Check yourself for injuries.
- ❖ Anticipate aftershocks, especially if the shaking lasted longer than two minutes.
- ❖ Stay out of damaged buildings. Listen to the radio or watch local TV for emergency information and additional safety instructions.

2. FLOOD

- ❖ All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised pucca house.
- ❖ If your area is flood – prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
- ❖ Tune to your local radio/TV for warnings and advice. Have an emergency kit ready.
- ❖ Keep dry food, drinking water and clothes ready, Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food covered, don't take heavy meals.
- ❖ Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
- ❖ Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods.

- ❖ Pack warm clothing, essential medication, valuables, personal papers, etc. in waterproof bags, to be taken with your emergency kit.
- ❖ Raise furniture, clothing and valuable onto beds, tables and in attic.
- ❖ Turn off the main electricity power supply. Do not use electrical appliances, which have been in flood water.
- ❖ Do not get into water of unknown depth and current.
- ❖ Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.

3. CYCLONE

- ❖ Listen to radio or TV weather reports and alert everyone through a loud speaker or by going home to home.
- ❖ Identify safe shelter in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest route to reach them.
- ❖ Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc., ready.
- ❖ Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate food grains and water in safe places.
- ❖ Conduct Mock Drills for your family and the community.
- ❖ Do not venture into the sea. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
- ❖ Remain indoors until advised that the cyclone has passed away.
- ❖ Do not go out till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back.
- ❖ Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush.
- ❖ Be careful of broken powers lines, damaged roads and house, fallen trees etc.

4. FIRE

- ❖ In case of fire, dial 101 (or the special number for FIRE SERVICE in your area/town)
- ❖ Learn at least two escape routes and ensure they are free from obstacles.
- ❖ Remain calm, unplug all electrical appliances.
- ❖ Keep bucket of water and blankets ready.
- ❖ If clothes catch fire, Stop, Drop and Roll.

- ❖ In case of uncontrolled fire, wrap the victim in a blanket, till the fire ceases/stops.
- ❖ Don't burn crackers in crowded, congested places, narrow lanes or inside the house.
- ❖ Don't cover crackers with tin containers or glass bottles for extra sound effect.
- ❖ Avoid wearing long loose clothes, as they are fast in catching fire.
- ❖ Don't remove burnt clothing (unless it comes off easily).
- ❖ Don't apply adhesive dressing on the burnt area.
- ❖ Don't throw lighted cigarette butts.

5. LANDSLIDE

- ❖ Avoid building houses near steep slopes, close to mountain edges, near drainage ways or along natural erosion valleys.
- ❖ Avoid going to places affected by debris flow. If mud flow areas, build channels to direct the flow around buildings.
- ❖ Stay alert and awake. Many deaths from landslides occur while people are sleeping.
- ❖ Listen for unusual sounds that might indicate moving debris, such as trees cracking or boulders knocking together.
- ❖ Move away from the landslide path or debris flow as quickly as possible.
- ❖ Avoid river valleys and low-lying areas. If you are near a stream or channel, be alert for any sudden increase or decrease in water flow and notice whether the water changes from clear to muddy.
- ❖ Go to designated public shelter if you have been told to evacuate.
- ❖ Stay away from the slide area as there may be danger of additional slides.
- ❖ Check for injured and trapped persons near the slide, without entering the direct slide area.

6. DROUGHT

- ❖ Never pour water down the drain, use it to water your indoor plants or garden.
- ❖ Repair dripping taps by replacing washers.
- ❖ Check all plumbing for leaks and get them repaired.
- ❖ Choose appliances that are more energy and water efficient.
- ❖ Develop and use cop contingency plan to meet drought situation.
- ❖ Plant drought-tolerant grasses, shrubs and trees.

- ❖ Install irrigation devices which are most water efficient for each use, such as micro and drip irrigation.
- ❖ Consider implementing rainwater harvesting wherever it is suitable.
- ❖ Avoid flushing the toilet unnecessarily.
- ❖ Avoid letting the water run while brushing your teeth, washing your face or shaving.

7. TSUNAMI

- ❖ Find out if your home is in the danger zone.
- ❖ Know the height of your street/house above sea level and the distance from the coast.
- ❖ People living along the coast should consider earthquake or strong ground rumbling as a warning signal.
- ❖ Try and climb a raised platform or climb the highest floor of any house or building which you might see.
- ❖ Make evacuation plans and a safe route for evacuation. Stay away from the beach.
- ❖ Never go down near the beach to watch the Tsunami.
- ❖ Listen to a radio or television to get the latest information and be ready to evacuate if asked to do so.
- ❖ If you hear an official warning, evacuate at once. Return home only after authorities advice it is safe to do so.
- ❖ Stay tuned to battery-operated radio for the latest emergency information. Help injured and trapped persons.
- ❖ Stay away from flooded and damaged areas until officials say it is safe to return.
- ❖ Enter your home with caution.
- ❖ Use flashlight entering damaged houses. Check for electrical short circuit and live wires.
- ❖ Check food supplies and test drinking water.

8. HEAT WAVE

- ❖ Install temporary window reflectors such as aluminum foil-covered cardboard, to reflect heat back outside.
- ❖ Cover windows that receive morning or afternoon sun with drapes, shades.

- ❖ Listen to local weather forecasts and make yourself aware of upcoming temperature changes.
- ❖ Know those in your neighborhood who are elderly, young, sick or overweight. They are more likely to become victims of excessive heat and may need help.
- ❖ Get trained in first aid to learn how to treat heat-related emergencies.
- ❖ Never leave children or pets alone in closed vehicles. Stay indoors as much as possible and limit exposure to the sun.
- ❖ Stay on the lowest floor out of the sunshine.
- ❖ Eat well-balanced, light and regular meals.
- ❖ Drink plenty of water; even if you do not feel thirsty.
- ❖ Persons with epilepsy or heart, kidney, or liver disease; are on fluid-restricted diets; or have a problem with fluid retention should consult a doctor before increasing liquid intake.
- ❖ Protect face and head by wearing a hat or cloth.

9. COLD WAVE

- ❖ Keep ready the Emergency Kit along with snow shovels, wood for your fireplace and adequate clothing.
- ❖ Listen to local Radio Station for weather updates.
- ❖ Stay indoors; minimize travel.
- ❖ Keep dry. Change wet clothing frequently to prevent loss of body heat.
- ❖ Watch for symptoms of frostbite like numbness, white or pale appearance on fingers, toes, ear lobes, and the tip of the nose.
- ❖ Maintain proper ventilation when using kerosene heaters or coal oven to avoid toxic fumes.
- ❖ Go to a designated public shelter, if your home loses power or heat during extreme cold.
- ❖ Protect yourself, from frostbite and hypothermia by wearing warm, loose fitting, lightweight clothing in layers.

10. EPIDEMICS

- ❖ Store atleast two week supply of water and food.
- ❖ Periodically check availability of your regular prescription medicines.
- ❖ Have non-prescription medicines and other health supplies in hand, including pain relievers, stomach remedies, cough and cold medicines, fluids with electrolytes and vitamins.

- ❖ Volunteer with local groups to prepare and assist during emergency response.
- ❖ Keep your surroundings clean and do not let the water be stagnant.
- ❖ Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When sick, keep distance from others to protect them from getting sick.
- ❖ If possible, stay at home; keep away from work, school etc., when you are sick. This will help prevent others from getting infected.
- ❖ Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue while coughing or sneezing. Washing your hands often will help protect you from harmful germs.
- ❖ Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs are often spread when a person touch something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose or mouth.

11. THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- ❖ Keep ready an Emergency Kit with important medication. Postpone outdoor activities.
- ❖ Remember, rubber-soled shoes and rubber tires provide no protection form lightning.
- ❖ Unplug any all electrical/electronic equipment/appliances such as bubs, computers fans etc., and turn off air conditioners well before the storm arrives.
- ❖ Use your battery-operated Radio for news updates.
- ❖ Avoid contact with electrical equipments or cords.
- ❖ Do not lie on concrete/marble floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- ❖ Continue to listen to local radio and television stations for updated information or instructions, as access to roads or some parts of the locality may be blocket.
- ❖ Help people who may require special assistance, such as infants, children, women and elderly.
- ❖ Stay away from broken power lines and report them immediately.

12. FOREST FIRE

- ❖ Try to maintain forest blocks to prevent day litter from forests during summer season.
- ❖ Try to put the fire out by digging or circle around it by water, if not possible call a Fire bridge.
- ❖ Move farm animals & movable goods to safer places.

- ❖ During fire listen regularly to radio for advance information & obey to instruction cum advice.
- ❖ Teach the causes and harm of fire to your family and others. Make people aware about forest fire safety.
- ❖ Do not be scared when a sudden fire occur in the forest, be calm & encourage others & community to overcome the problem patiently.
- ❖ Do apply seasonal mitigation measures i.e., fuel reduction etc.
- ❖ Don't throw smoldering cigarette butts or bidi in the forest.
- ❖ Don't leave the burning wood sticks in or near the forest.
- ❖ Don't enter the forest during the fire.
- ❖ Discourage community to use Slash & Burn methods.
